

### OLD-TIME PARADE WILL BE FEATURE FOR JACKSONVILLE

#### Citizens Rummage in Old Trunks for Finery of By-Gone Days As Annual Gold Rush Jubilee Nears

Many old trunks, long stored in attics, are being scoured for remnants that made grandmother and grandfather the social lions of their day, for Jacksonville—Oregon's first gold camp—is planning an old-time parade as a highlight of her Gold Rush Jubilee which will be held Saturday, August 19.

Bustless, leg-of-mutton sleeves, red petticoats and claw-hammer coats are being resurrected and groomed for service when the historic parade starts down the main street of the famous old town late afternoon on the big day, for Jacksonville has invited all to enter into the spirit of the occasion and to dress the part. Even burros are being curried for the event, for it will truly place on parade all the odds and ends, frills and fads of a bygone day when hoary miners gouged out treasures from the Jacksonville pay dirt.

The pioneer parade which will award many cash prizes for best costumes, rigs and accessories, will be but one of the many features of this year's Gold Rush Jubilee. There will be a two-day rodeo, mammoth outdoor wrestling arena, three dances, historic museum, the spot where gold was first discovered in the state, producing backyard gold mines, dozens of contests and races with substantial prizes. In fact, from early morning hours till dawn of the next day Jacksonville will provide her guests with a never-ending array of free entertainment features. Hard rock crullers, muckers, log rollers, clowns and bands all will demonstrate their abilities. Tough sourdoughs, grizzly pocket hunters and inveterate gamblers, like in the days of old, will parade the streets and "paint" the town red.

In anticipation of great throngs, and to make their stay both comfortable and pleasant, the Jacksonville chamber of commerce officials have provided free picnic and camp facilities.

### BEAN CANNING IS ORDER OF DAY AT ARMORY KITCHEN

Summer is here in all her glory, but many people, like "the busy little bee," are already thinking of winter, and making plans to carry some of the health and sunshine of summer into the darker days. How? "In cans of beans," say those who are working busily at the Armory kitchen under auspices of the Jackson county relief committee, of which A. S. V.

Carpenter is chairman and Mrs. R. E. Green, secretary.

Canning of the string bean crop is in full swing this week at the Armory. The women are canning at the kitchen each day but Saturday and Sunday, from 8 o'clock in the morning until 4 o'clock in the evening.

Any women receiving notices announcing their eligibility to participate in the canning operations are asked to call at the relief headquarters in the city hall to make further arrangements regarding when to appear at the Armory kitchen.

Anyone with surplus beans is also asked to call 824 or to come to the relief committee headquarters or the Armory kitchen, where the committee will arrange to call for the product.

Mrs. Louie B. Humphreys is manager of the Armory kitchen, where 360 cans of beans were preserved Tuesday. Two and a half pound cans

are used. All women at the kitchen participate in the work, then each takes her allotment of beans.

The Armory kitchen is just one station in the county-wide project, which is expected to aid many in supplying families with food next winter. Other stations are being opened in various sections of the valley, under direction of Mrs. Mabel Mack, home demonstration agent, and Mrs. Green. They will arrange the canning centers in outlying districts.

### BIG FORCE HALTS BUTTE FALLS FIRE

Fire, which burned over 18 or 20

acres of cut-over land in the Butte Falls district near the new fish hatchery, is out, according to the state forest patrol office. The fire broke out Tuesday noon, starting from sparks from a railroad train.

One hundred CCC recruits from the Lake of the Woods camp and 25 CCC men from the Moon Prairie camp, 75 Owen-Oregon men and the state forestry headquarters crew of 12 placed the fire under control.

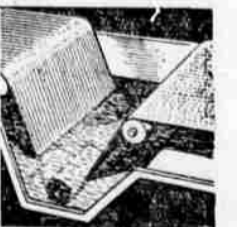
