# Final Workouts Slated Tonight

## THREE DAY TEST OF FIGHTING MEN STARTS MONDAY

All Medford Entrants Will See Action On Opening Night Says Matchmaker—Doors Open At 7 P. M.

The last workout will be held at the open-air training camp at 7:30 tonight, training gloves will then be tossed into the lockers, and Medford's game fighting men will make ready to enter the ring to fare for better or for worse against the "enemy" in the grand opening of the American Legion's great relief fund benefit championship amateur boxing tournament at the Armory arena here next Monday night. And on the showing the Medford hunkies make will their flinty stock rise or fall several points on the car-mingling mart of this part of the country. The mighty ring spectacle is to last for three nights in a row, ending Wednesday.

### Medford Ring Stars on Monday's Card.

All of Medford's sensational amateur fighters will get in action on the official opening bill of the big tourney Monday night, Lee Showers, director-in-chief for the gigantic ring melee, announced today. They will collide with outside foemen. His associate director is Dick Russell, in charge of out-of-town ringmen.

With designs on the national championships in New York city or Boston, the local body-breakers will climb through the ropes Monday night with heart and mind set upon spreading the fame of Medford and Oregon throughout this territory by man-mauling their way into possession of the Jack Dempsey trophy, Al Piche trophy, and other awards that go to the winners.

### Congressman Mott Invited.

Scheduled to address a Chamber of Commerce meeting at noon Monday, Congressman Mott has been asked to remain over to keep time on the first pair of gladiators who throw glowing flares at each other on Monday night's thrilling program of fights.

In order to properly care for the huge gathering of ring disciples expected to view the hostilities, the box office and doors are open at the Armory arena at 7 o'clock Monday night, Carl Y. Tengwall, chairman of the tourney committee, declared today. Large electric fans will be going full force all around the arena Monday night to aid to the comfort of the spectators.

### Seats Moving.

From 15 to 20 wild and furious fights in all weight classes will make up the program Monday night. The first battle is to start promptly at 8:15 and
