

# SERVICE STATION OWNERS AGREE ON NRA PROCEDURE

Gates Reads Re-employment Agreement At Court House Meeting — Other Groups Will Get Together.

Last night at the court house a large and enthusiastic meeting of service station owners was held with C. E. Gates presiding. The meeting was the outcome of a general meeting of the automotive trade held last week and will be followed by other meetings of various automotive groups in order that the automotive trade may be thoroughly organized under the national recovery act.

Purpose of the meeting was explained by Frank Hull, who stated that now was the time for all service station operators to co-operate and work together not only for the purpose of living up to the requirements of the national recovery act, but for the benefit of each man's business.

J. H. Maasasa explained the purpose of the Oregon Automotive Trade Association and stated that a number of station owners had joined this week and it was hoped that the majority would associate themselves with the state organization.

C. E. Gates read the president's re-employment agreement and each phase of it was discussed thoroughly after which by unanimous approval the service station operators decided to accept the president's blanket code. An analysis of the blanket code as it pertains to the automotive industry compiled by the Oregon Automotive Trade Association, was read and a very thorough discussion of same was entered into.

Service station operators, as well as the district managers of five major oil companies, entered into the discussion.

After the various points in this temporary code had been explained to all present, a motion was made and unanimously adopted that the service station operators in the city of Medford adopt it. A motion was also made thanking the Chamber of Commerce for its assistance in bringing about the meetings of the various groups and an announcement was made by W. A. Young that next Tuesday at 7:30 p. m. in the court house auditorium another group consisting of blacksmiths, painters, top men, welding and machine workers, garages, and all industries of any mechanical nature, including greasers, connected with the automotive trade would be held.

The analysis as outlined by the Oregon Automotive Trade Association is as follows: "To effectuate the successful operation of the president's re-employment agreement, which the retail automotive industry of Oregon pledges itself to support to the full extent of its ability

"9—To sell gasoline to the consumer at prices below those posted at all company service stations.

"10—To sell merchandise or service at a discount to retailers who do not observe this voluntary code or the president's re-employment agreement.

"11—To patronize any automotive concern that does not observe this voluntary code or the president's re-employment agreement.

"12—To patronize any concern that does not observe the true spirit of the president's re-employment agreement.

"In order that thousands of gasoline retailers may co-operate with the president in this emergency, we appeal to the oil companies, pending the adoption of a national petroleum marketing code, to

"Extend the maximum discount to so-called 100 per cent contract retailers to all independent dealers.

"Grant the highest discount now in effect for the sale of all grades of motor fuel."

## Rulings of NRA Are Made Plain

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—(AP)—What does the NRA mean?

The following questions were developed and answered today by the national recovery administration:

Is Sunday considered a legal holiday by the NRA as it affects the maximum hours a person may work each week?

A legal holiday is one that involves peak periods such as Christmas or Thanksgiving. Under the spirit of the NRA, officials believe, Sunday cannot be construed as such.

Are men delivering from store to store and men delivering from store to customer both classified as delivery men?

Yes. The necessity for delivery is considered the same in both cases.

Under the retail merchants code, how long is an employe expected to work on Saturday?

Eight hours.

Does the NRA consider any stigma attached to taking away the Blue Eagle from one who has signed a code?

No. It will be just as though they never had a Blue Eagle and NRA officials believe that is enough.

When the Blue Eagle is taken away can it ever be restored?

No.

Who has the authority for taking the Blue Eagle away from a firm or individual?

Administrator Hugh S. Johnson must have the record presented to him to determine just what the issues are and he decides whether or not the eagle will be called back.

Can a retail store, open less than

52 hours a week before July 1, 1933, reduce the store hours at all?

No.

Are retail stores with two or less employes, which keep open only the minimum number of hours required, fulfilling their part?

Yes.

Are there any figures available as to how many people have sent in their certificates of compliance under the president's re-employment agreement?

No. The NRA proposes to wait until the period is up and then make such a survey.
