

Colored House of David Team Clashes With Rogues This Evening

BEWHISKERED NINE PLAYS HIGH CLASS BRAND BASEBALL

Baseball fans from miles around will flock to the fair grounds this evening to see the colorful House of David team clash with the Medford Rogues. The House of David team is composed of bewhiskered colored players of which several are major league caliber. The team has several features which include Chapple Gray, the beardless clown, Babe Favors, the Babe Ruth of negro players, and Joe Williams, the Geo. E. Brown of the team. The combination twins, Ausley and Thompson, make double play a specialty at second base. These boys will keep fans laughing continually.

The colored boys beat Grants Pass 7 to 5 Saturday and Coquille yesterday 13 to 5. The largest crowd ever to witness a game at Coquille, was present, estimated at 1100 admissions. The team will leave Medford immediately after the game for Reno, Nevada, where they are scheduled to play tomorrow afternoon.

The Rogues, although beaten by Grants Pass yesterday, can be relied upon to give a good account of themselves.

Manager Hal Haight reports that he will have several new faces in the line-up. Haight was badly spiked in the knees yesterday while catching a runner off second base, and has signed Harry Dunn to replace him at shortstop. Jack Hughes will also be in the line-up.

Due to the expense involved in bringing in the House of David team, the admission price to the game will be 40c. The game will start promptly at 8:30.

At the request of fans who will be late in arriving Manager Haight has arranged for the whiskered boys to put on their pepper game at the end of the fourth inning. They will also give an exhibition of shadow ball playing, when they take the field for their infield practice.

Virginia Van Wie Defends Golf Crown Against World's Greatest Women Stars

HIGHLAND PARK, Ill. — (AP) — Spurred on by the absence of Glenna Collett Vare, five-times titleholder, one of the largest fields in years will open fire on Virginia VanWie's national golf championship at picturesque Exmoor today.

Enid Wilson, winner of the British championship three years in succession, will be in the field and a marked woman in the title drive, but Glenna's absence, forced by her maternal duties, has given American women, notably the stars of a new generation of golf, added hope that this might be the year for them to break through.

"Big six" Stand Out.
All through the field of 119 entries are names familiar in championship discussion.

Among the campaigners who have been starring for a decade or more

are such shotmakers as Helen "Billy" Hicks of Hewlett, Long Island, probably the outstanding favorite to regain the crown she won in 1931; Maureen Orcutt of White Beaches, Hawthorn, N. Y., long one of the big contenders; Mrs. Leona Cheney of Los Angeles, one of powder puff golf's best iron artists, and Mrs. O. S. Hill of Kansas City, three times western champion and one of the bright stars of last winter's campaign.

Those four, with Miss VanWie and Mrs. Vare, constitute perhaps the big six of American feminine golf.

In the championship at Exmoor they and Miss Wilson rank as near-regarded favorites, one of them regarded almost a cinch to win the title.

On the basis of brilliant performances this year, many younger or less famed stars are granted an outside chance to break through to become queen of American golf.

Many Young Stars.
Among them are June Beebe of Chicago, women's western open champion; Aneta Gorczyca of Fort Worth, Texas, southern titleholder; Beatrice Gottlieb, the Tuckahoe, N. Y. girl who shot an 80 to defeat the Prince of Wales; Jane Weiler, silent Chicago girl with a perfect swing; Lucille Robinson of Des Moines, who upset Miss VanWie, 6 and 5, in the finals of the women's western; Phyllis Buchanan of Denver, trans-Mississippi champion; Frances Williams of Wayne, Pa., South Atlantic titleholder, and others.

Long, Hard Layout.
Exmoor, a stretch of 6,473 yards and women's par of 39-40, ranks as one of Chicago's hardest courses, though it should fit in well for the long range games of Miss Hicks and Miss Wilson, who reached the third round last year before she was eliminated by Charlotte Glutting of West Orange, N. J.

Trees line most of the fairways and traps are numerous, placed to catch stray shots.

The qualifying round over 18 holes is scheduled today, after which the low 31 scorers and Miss VanWie were to pair up for 18-hole match play skirmishes. The final on September 3 will be 36 holes.

Fishing Lines Hints for Those Who Angle in Southern Oregon Waters

Lieutenant and Mrs. H. A. Stanley and their two sons, Harry and Don, enjoyed excellent fishing luck over the week-end at Diamond lake and on the north fork of Rogue river, the lieutenant reported today. Their record included four limits of fine rainbow trout from Diamond lake, and also four limits of rainbow and eastern brook trout from the river. All were nice large fish, and were caught on flies. Queen of Waters and March Brown were used both in the lake and the river, Lieutenant Stanley said.

A member of the state police game division was at Diamond lake yesterday, and reported that trout fishing is still good, and that the fish are fair sized.

Lansing Tevis, Burlingame millionaire, and his guest from the Bay district, are spending several days at Californian-on-the-Rogue, fishing.

Mr. and Mrs. O. D. Douglas and Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Pitt of San Antonio, Tex., purchased fishing licenses last week-end and intend to do some angling in the Rogue, and also try their luck at Diamond lake before continuing to the southern state. They plan to make the return journey by way of eastern Oregon and Salt Lake City.

Among Medford and former Medford people who have lured fine specimens of the finny tribe from Siltcoos lake quite recently are R. G. Beach, assistant postmaster at Medford, who reeled in a five-pound five ounce bass one day week before last, and P. F. Cline, postmaster at Siltcoos and formerly a resident of Medford, whose fishpole and line did a lively dance until a six and a half pound bass was safely landed. Remarkably fine weather has prevailed this summer in the Siltcoos region—neither too hot nor too cold.

Miss Lura Marie Roberson of this city, who was a guest at the Perl home on Klamath lake over the week-end, landed her first trout Sunday, her prize catch being a nine-pound rainbow.

Jimmie Moore and J. V. Watson, who fished the Rogue river near Trail yesterday, each got his limit of steelhead. The catches were all made using single eggs, they reported.

M. M. (Mike) Herman of Hubbard Brook, fished Rogue river Sunday, and landed several fish, it was learned today.

HERMOSA BEACH, Cal., Aug. 28.— (AP)—Bitten by a 15-foot "blue" shark which he had landed on his fishing boat, Nathaniel C. Myrick, young telephone company executive, suffered painful injury, it was revealed today.

The shark, still thrashing when it was brought aboard the boat, ripped open Myrick's arm, severing the main arteries and tearing the flesh apart the entire length of his arm. Thirty-two stitches were taken.

M' DONALD SMITH WINS WESTS OPEN

OLYMPIA FIELDS, Ill., Aug. 28.— (AP)—After an eight year absence, MacDonald Smith, the old Scot, was back on the western open golf championship throne today.

Refusing to fade out against one of the largest fields that ever sought the title, the 43-year-old veteran who makes his living making clubs at Nashville, Tenn., and being the younger generation in golf championships, won the western open crown with ease yesterday, finishing the 72-hole grand at Olympia Fields with a 282 total that beat his closest rival, Tommy Armour of Chicago, by six shots, the trophy and top

money of \$800 went to Mac after his victory march.

Yesterday's triumph was the third since 1912 for Mac, who has never been able to rout his jinx and realize his dream of a British or American open championship. He won his first western open title at Flossmoor, a few miles north of here, 21 years ago with a medal card of 289 and in 1925 at the Youngstown, Ohio, Country Club with 281 shots.

Third in the championship test was Abe Espinosa of Chicago, 1928 champion, who ran second to Mac until the 63rd hole, winding up with third place money of \$200 with 289. Armour's prize money was \$300.
