NOT GOOD, NOT BAD OUTLOOK FOR GRID SEASON AT O. S. C.

New Coach Says No One Will Take Beavers Seriously Until Results Shown—12 Lettermen Are Lost

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis, Sept. 4.—"Our outlook is not bad and it's not good. We have nothing to moan about and nothing to groan about. Nobody will take us seriously until we do something." This is the way Lon Stiner, new head football coach here, sizes up football prospects at Oregon State College for the coming season.

Even though Oregon State lost 12 lettermen from last year's squad of 18, more are expected back in uniform to battle with many other prospects for first string positions this fall. Lettermen whose services will be missed most are Keith Davis, left end, who did much of the passing and punting last season; Charley Miller, who played either left guard or left tackle, and one of the outstanding linemen on the coast; Harold Moe, considered by many the best blocking halfback on the coast last season; Loren Tuttle, regular right guard and Tommy Ward, sensational backfield performer. Other lettermen lost are Everett Davis, Herman Leaf and Fred MacDonald, ends; Wayne Harn, tackle; Ted Hermann, quarterback; Frank Little, fullback; and Hugh Stanford, guard.

Here are the outstanding prospects for the 1933 team:
Left ends: Maynard Schultz of Corvallis, a product of last year's freshman team; Milton Campbell of Portland, varsity reserve last year, and Bill Jessup of Lindsay, Cal., from last year's freshman team.

Left tackles: Tar Schwanen of Oakland, Cal., two-year lettermen, who has been switched from right tackle, and Don Wagner of Corvallis, a one-year lettermen.

Left guards: Bill Tomasek of Harvey, Ill., a one-year lettermen; Tommy Miles of Honolulu, one-year lettermen; John King of Cottage Grove, varsity center last year, and Stanley Rollins of Portland, member of last year's freshman team.

Centers: Clyde DeVine of Burlingame, Cal., varsity reserve last year, and Willis Danforth of Bend, one-year lettermen.

Right guards: Stanley McClurg of Portland, member of last year's freshman team; Vernon Wedin of Gresham, transfer from Oregon Normal school, and Bill Keena of Minneapolis, a one-year lettermen.

Right tackles: Harry Field of Honolulu, one-year lettermen, and Dan Mitoh of Portland, who made his letter at end last season.

Right ends: Vic Curtin of Portland, a two-year lettermen at center and end, and Woody Jolin of Corvallis, member of last season's freshman team.

"Why is it, Johnny, that when I'm out with my regular foursome, playing for small stakes, my game is from 10 to 15 strokes better than when I play in my club tournaments?"

Every golf professional will recognize the question for it is extremely common. There may be one of a thousand answers.

However, I think that every golfer whether an outstanding prize winner or an amateur in club competition, finds himself inclined to press when he enters tournament play. This will ruin any shot.

My advice is to try to forget that you are playing against your opponent's ball. Disregard his shots entirely. Don't watch his play, his technique, where his ball lands, or anything else concerning his game. Figure out for yourself on each hole the number of strokes your average game indicates as your score, and then play for this goal, not for what your opponent is doing.
