

MEDFORD CCC LAD IS AMATEUR KING OF LIGHTWEIGHTS

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 7.—(AP)—California and Oregon boxers divided eight of the Pacific coast amateur boxing championships as the annual titulary tourney came to an end here last night, while William Pettijohn, a CCC worker from Chicago, now stationed in Medford, won the other award.

Once again, Johnny Aulre, 112-pounder from Los Angeles, was the sensation of the night's bouts, just as he had been on the opening night. The clever little defending champion tilted scored a technical knockout over the hard punching Ambrose Loyza, Buckley, A. C. Oakland in the second stanza.

Paul Shumway, middleweight from Central Oregon, met his master in another of the evening's features. Harold McDonald of Salinas, Cal., punched him into submission in the second canto of their championship mix.

Dick Foster, a clever 147-pounder from Oakland, carried off the welter crown with a nice exhibition of boxing that gave him a decision over Eddie Golly of Portland, while Frank Connolly, heavyweight defending champion from San Francisco, accounted for the other golden state win on a default from Andrea Lind, Jr., Spokane, who suffered a broken cartilage in his nose during a semifinal bout.

William Pettijohn, the CCC worker from Chicago, who is stationed at Medford, took the lightweight title on a close decision over Al McLean of San Diego. Four Portland boxers carried off

titles for Oregon's share of the awards. Mike Sabah, Spivey A. C. 126-pounder, outboxed Richard Stokes, Eagles, Seattle, to gain the judges' verdict while his teammate, Frank Hammer, punched his way to the light heavyweight crown with a two-round knockout over Ken Anderson, Portland boxing school entrant. Multnomah club boxers won the other two, Harry Cortez taking the award for the 118-pounders, while Kermit Stewart decimated Al Penns, Spokane, to win in the 126-pound class.

LONG TENNIS REST ORDER FOR HELEN

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 7.—(AP)—For six months at least Helen Willis Moody, dethroned tennis queen, must not touch a racket, and then, in the words of her father, Dr. C. A. Willis, "only time will tell."

Dr. Willis, who ordered his daughter to a hospital here where she is now under treatment, said he hoped Mrs. Moody will be able to compete in the national tournament next year. Tennis followers here, however, noted that Dr. Willis said the injury which caused Mrs. Moody to default to Helen Jacobs in the national women's singles, "is prone to recur under the strain of competition." They saw in this an intimation that Mrs. Moody may be permanently out of major competition.

Her condition was described by her father as due to pressure on a sciatic nerve between the fifth lumbar vertebrae and the sacrum.

KARASICK, WOLFE GRAPPLE TONIGHT ON ARMORY CARD

Two of the most colorful wrestlers in the business will tangle at the armory tonight in an effort to determine which is the best man. Al Karasick, roving "Russian Lion," whose antics usually throw the fans into a frenzy, will again meet Les Wolfe, handsome mat artist from Texas, after having wrestled to a draw here some time ago. In the opening fracas on Promoter Mack Lillard's mat card, Fireman Ray Fribble, Medford's home-grown "trip and grunt" exponent, will face Herman Olson, Seattle Swede.

In their last match here, Wolfe, who uses a recently developed "turn-over leg scissors" to gain most of his falls, had the former ballet dancer, Karasick, softened up to the point where it looked like a sure fall, but was forced to release the Russian by the final bell.

Tonight, Wolfe plans to start putting the pressure on Al from the first gong and those who saw him use the new-fangled hold before are betting their money that Karasick will not get a draw this time. The Fribble-Olson brawl will also have its points of interest as Olson has been seen here in action against another local grappler, Swede Anderson. Olson handled the local boy roughly in the encounter and Fribble is out to avenge the wrongs done his buddy.

The mat show, the first in several weeks, will open at 8:30 tonight instead of 9 o'clock as in previous cards.

TONY POLONI WINS NOD OVER BILLY DONOHUE

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 7.—(AP)—Tony Poloni, 178-pound Reno, Nev., fighter, who formerly held the California light heavyweight title, won a 10-round decision over Billy Donohue, 170, New York, here last night. Donohue, former New York metropolitan light heavyweight champion, won but three rounds, though he floored the Nevada with a right to the jaw in one of them, the eighth.

BOSTON ITALIAN KAYOS GRIFFITH

BOSTON, Sept. 7.—(AP)—The Boston heavyweight picture, which has faded badly since the death of Ernie Schauf and the passage of Jack Sharkey from the championship ranks, may get some needed retouching from Tony Shucco, the north end Italian youngster.

Tony surprised his home-town admirers last night by knocking out Tuffy Griffiths, experienced Chicago brawler, in the fourth round of the scheduled 10-rounder at Mechanics' building, where the curtain was rung up on Boston's indoor boxing season. Griffiths, who has been demanding a crack at Sharkey, weighed 187 and had 10 pounds on Tony, who kept stinging him with a machine-gun left for three rounds as Tuffy floundered around with his body attack.
