

### KELLY ENTHUSED BY NEW TASK IN NATION'S CAPITAL

A thrilling letter, with every page an outburst of enthusiasm regarding his findings in Washington, D. C. was received today from Edward C. Kelly by Mrs. Kelly, who remained here when he left for the capital, and the only file in the Democratic cabinet, says she (from her viewpoint, not her husband's) is the little brunette from Virginia, who happens to be secretary to the attorney on public and municipal loans in the public works program—the title placed on Medford's Ed. (And yet, she might have been a blonde.)

Attorney Kelly is working directly under E. H. Foley, who is in turn assistant to Secretary Ioka. As a member of the legal department of the public works program, Kelly has received as special assignment, his letter reveals, the public and municipal loans of the public works program.

He and the other workers are located in the department of interior building, and the attitude which prevails there, he described in his letter today, as one which will keep all workers on their toes. He arrived in Washington Monday, and Tuesday was given the oath of office and started to work, making a study of the President's and the administrator's written rules and memoranda.

Kelly was assigned to his particular work by Foley, who is also a young man, a New Yorker and an Irishman. Young men predominate on the public works staff, according to the letter, and all are enthusiastic and hard workers, who appear to have jobs of great matter and much vision. "Ed" and the other attorney working near him in the legal department, have their own offices in the department of interior building and their own secretaries. The whole set-up, Kelly described as appearing much more important than he had anticipated, and his own particular job, as a large one, which is going to demand a lot of real work.

Friendliness, he stated, however, prevails throughout the building, and made his arrival seem more like a homecoming than entrance into a strange city, when he got to Washington headquarters. Congratulations were forthcoming from every side, and Jackson county's representative to the Oregon legislature decided before the first day was over that Washington's opinion of Oregonians isn't bad at all.

The instructions of Ioka, Kelly was informed, demand non-partisan appointments in the public works program, and politics are forgotten in favor of accomplishment.

### DIAMOND LAKE FISHING PROVIDES BIG THRILL FOR CALIFORNIA GROUP

R. M. Dyar of Beverly Hills, Cal., ex-president of the Truscon Steel corporation, and J. B. Allen of the same city, and their party of friends, spent several weeks fishing at Diamond lake, in Rogue river and other streams and lakes in Oregon, and report splendid luck. Mr. Dyar said, when leaving for home:

"During the last month we have been fishing at Diamond lake, using flies exclusively, and have consistently had the best records of all fishermen there, spinner and trouterman fishermen included. We caught the limit of five fish daily, and usually kept only the largest ones, running three to five pounds. If the one-pounders were not badly hooked, we slipped them back into the water."

"We could not understand why more people there do not fish with flies. We used No. 4 and No. 6 bucktail McGintys, and when little black flies were coming over the lake we used black gnats."

Having enjoyed this three-month taste of Oregon waters, the men said they expect to return for another long session next summer, and will persuade a few wealthy friends to come along with them.

### BIG THERMOMETER FAIR ATTRACTION

CHICAGO. — (UP) — The largest thermometer in the world is on exhibit, or rather, is serving as a Century of Progress exposition.

The thermometer stands 218 feet from the ground level, is faced on three sides and is making a bid as one of the most "outstanding" exhibits at the fair.

Guards at the fair grounds are becoming weary of people wanting to know this and that about the giant temperature gauge. Most of the visitors want to know whether there is really mercury in the "tube." They explain the "mercury" is really neon gas.

The real power which operates the thermometer needles at the bottom of the tower, and causes three columns to accurately give the temperature changes. A mercury thermometer is part of the controlling device and the tubes or "stems" of the tall thermometer are made up of a number of S-shaped neon lights, so closely joined that they seem to be solid glass tubing.

Signs Cause Caution.

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spending taxes for political purposes and then saying they have nothing for relief.

"But I am glad to say these instances are growing less. The people are understanding that we are not wielding the big stick, but making the obligation clear."

Mr. Roosevelt emphasized that the action of the federal government in giving relief appropriations was on an emergency basis and that he expected the government eventually to be relieved of this responsibility.

"The whole period we are now going through will in the end get back to individual initiative and responsibility," President optimistic.

The president spoke optimistically of the trend of affairs and said he expected everyone to co-operate in the relief drive.

"I believe you can do the work more effectively than last year," he said. "Taking it by and large the country is in a more hopeful mind."

"The people have more to spend and don't you let them tell you otherwise."

"There will be some who will have excuses, but there is going to be no such thing as being left out. No one can be left out. They've got to join you."

"You have a great responsibility on your shoulders and I know you are going to do it. This is an essential part in the program of the United States. Go to it, make a record, not only of money, but of service of which we will be very proud."

Build From Bottom.

"We have got to build from the bottom up," he said, "and not merely supply food from the top down."

Starting the conference later at a hotel, John Stewart Bryan, publisher of the Richmond, Virginia, News-Leader and president of Community Chests and Councils, Inc., declared mobilization for community help was in no way minimized by the fact that federal, state and municipal governments "are today carrying 86 per cent of the material unemployment relief load."

Praising President Roosevelt's "courage, initiative and hopefulness" in his handling of a desperate situation, Bryan said the first and supreme objective the restoration of the confidence of America in itself, has been achieved.
