PANTAGES A GRANDPA IS WORD FROM SON

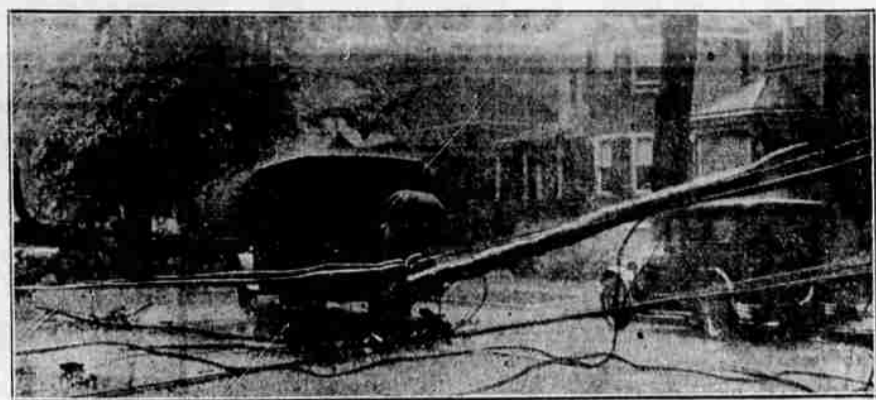

CULINARY CRAFT....

SOME "PEACHY" IDEAS

Because peaches accommodate themselves to so many uses, our selection of recipes has a very wide range. You will agree with me that peaches are a general favorite with most members of western families, so one can hardly go wrong in choosing from among the following:

- Peach Cocktail I: 6 peaches, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, 3 tablespoons powdered sugar, 2 tablespoons minced maraschino cherries, 2 tablespoons maraschino cherry juice.

- Peach Cocktail II: 3 peaches, 1 1/2 cup watermelon balls, 1 1/2 cup pineapple juice, 3 tablespoons pineapple juice, 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg, 2 tablespoons powdered sugar.

- Peach and Cantaloupe Salad: 1 cantaloupe, 1 orange, 2 peaches (large), lettuce, 1/2 cup French dressing.

- Peach Upside-Down Cake: 4 peaches, 1/2 cup almonds, 2 tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup watermelon balls, 1/2 cup pineapple juice, 1/2 cup nutmeg.

Peel peaches in halves. Place on crisp lettuce leaves and fill with a mixture of the celery, dates and nuts mixed with the sweetened whipped cream. Serve immediately after mixing.

III: 1 cup peaches, 1 cup banana, 1 cup pineapple, 1/2 cup grapes, 1/2 cup maraschino cherries, 1/2 large marshmallows, 1/2 cup shredded almonds, 1/2 cup whipping cream, 1/2 cup mayonnaise.

Peel peaches in halves and combine with quartered marshmallows, then mix all with the whipped cream and mayonnaise. Salt to taste and add sugar if necessary (depends upon sweetness of the fruit). Pour into freezing tray and freeze until solid.

Golden Dressing: 1/2 cup pineapple juice, 1/2 cup orange juice, 1/2 cup lemon juice, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 eggs, 1 cup whipping cream.

Peach Upside-Down Cake: 4 peaches, 1/2 cup almonds, 2 tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup watermelon balls, 1/2 cup pineapple juice, 1/2 cup nutmeg.

Peach and Cantaloupe Salad: 1 cantaloupe, 1 orange, 2 peaches (large), lettuce, 1/2 cup French dressing.

Pastry: 12 graham crackers rolled, 1-3 cup butter, softened, 1 tablespoon sugar. Roll the crackers fine and mix with softened butter and sugar.

Fresh Peach Pie: 2 1/2 cups sliced peaches, 4 tablespoons powdered sugar, 1 cup cream, whipped, sweetened, and 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Peach Marlow: 1 cup crushed peaches, 2 tablespoons sugar, 4 tablespoons peach juice, 2 tablespoons lemon juice, 20 marshmallows, 1 cup whipping cream.
