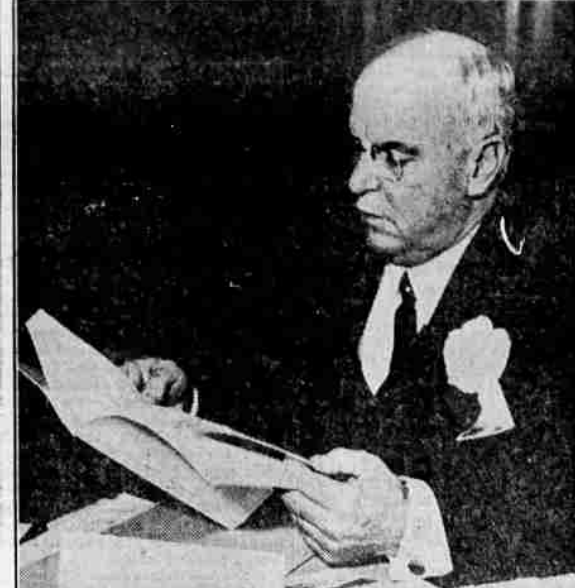
SAWMILL NEAR ROSEBURG BURNS
