Mrs. Bebb Enjoys Musical Life of New York City

Mrs. Roberta Ward Bebb, who has been spending a summer in the east delving into musical work and entertainment, will be returning to Medford in October to resume her classes in voice and piano, according to letters received last week from New York, where she has been particularly interested in the opera. In her letter Mrs. Bebb describes New York as very "opera minded" during the past summer, the crowds filling the Hippodrome consistently at all performances.

At the presentation of "Carmen," Mrs. Bebb heard Coe Glade, who appeared here last year on the Civic Music association program, sing the title role. During the past week she heard John Charles Thomas, internationally beloved baritone, sing at the large arena of the Madison Square Garden, together with the Metropolitan Opera chorus, with Cesare Sodero conducting.

Many of the New York public, she stated in her letter, prefer John Charles Thomas to Lawrence Tibbett.

Mrs. Bebb also writes that she is seeing all the new plays and musical comedies, as each week new ones are appearing in preparation for the winter season. She completed her summer course in piano and voice at the Institute of Musical Art of the Julliard School of Music about the middle of August. Frank Damrosch, now dean emeritus, was for years dean of the school. Dr. John Erskine, musician and professor at Columbia university, is president of the summer school of Julliard. Before the close of the school a lovely tea, given by Julliard on the roof gardens, was attended by Mrs. Bebb, who also took voice work during the summer under Fraser Gange, head of the voice department of Peabody Institute, and professor for a number of years at the Royal Academy of London.

The Medford musician also writes that she enjoyed tea and meeting Mrs. Andrea Parker at her studio this summer. Mrs. Parker, sister of the late George Andrews of this city, is the aunt with whom George Edward Andrews is studying voice in New York. His mother is also making her home with Mrs. Parker. Mrs. Bebb was looking forward to meeting Mrs. Andrews in the near future.
