

BUTTER TRADING SPEEDS UP WITH DROP IN PRICES

PORTLAND, Sept. 13.—(P)—Slightly more active trading in butter was reported by the trade here, following the decline ranging from 1c on 89 score to 2c on 92 score yesterday. Top score was quotable here at 20c.

Butter receipts continued heavy here, amounting to 86,346 pounds in the past week, as compared with 65,800 in the previous week and 69,180 pounds a year ago. There was plenty of fresh stuff for the trade. The market was reported only about steady.

Considerable into-retail movement of eggs was reported. The market generally was active in all its phases and steady at present price levels.

Receipts were barely able to meet the demand. In the week ending Wednesday receipts here amounted to 2,040 cases as compared with 2,441 cases in the same week a year ago. Prices were unchanged.

Cheese receipts at Portland in the past week dropped off sharply from the previous week, but still were above a year ago. The market was reported fully firm at unchanged prices. Most popular kinds were in consistent demand.

Supplies of good Oregon Gravenstein were moderate and the market was winding up the week fully steady at from \$1.25 to \$1.40 for extra fancy and down to 70c for jumble pack.

Peaches were slightly weaker, with prospects of a little too heavy carry over on some stocks. Prices ranged from 5c to 10c down on Elbertas. Hales in moderate supply and about steady.

Today's grapes eased off somewhat for the Friday trade, ranging down to \$1.60.

Real fancy veal was scarce and was firm at 10 to 10 1/2c on 90 to 120-pound stuff.

Most lines poultry were in ample supply except good quality springs, which were scarce and firm at current prices.

Some improvement was noted in the demand for bulls and the market is fairly steady at around 4 1/2 to 5c.

Iowa Belle, a wilt-resistant watermelon developed at Iowa State college, is reported "doing well" in disease-infested fields of eastern Iowa.
