

MARGOT ASQUITH GIVES SIDELIGHTS ON ROYAL FAMILY

LONDON, Sept. 22.—(AP)—The former German Kaiser's alleged fear that the late Queen Alexandra of England intended to poison him is one of the many stories related by the countess of Oxford and Asquith, better known as Margot Asquith, in a book of reminiscences published today.

Following the visit of King Edward and Queen Alexandra to Berlin in 1909, Mrs. Asquith, as the author then was known, asked the queen what she had discussed with the Kaiser during meals. "The Kaiser ate so little," the queen replied, "that one day I said to him: 'You work and worry—why don't you eat? Eating is food for the brain.'"

"Looking affronted," the Kaiser said, "you find me stupid." Then the queen described how she made a little twist with her fingers in front of the Kaiser's face saying, "well what about all this kiddoos over your navy?"

The Kaiser, the queen added, appeared to take this in good part. But according to the reminiscences, Queen Alexandra said she gave the Kaiser a box of meat lozenges to stimulate his appetite. They were inspected by the Kaiser and a doctor. "Stupid man," exclaimed the queen to Mrs. Asquith. "He thought I wanted to poison him."

The writer recalls another conversation with Queen Alexandra concerning King Edward's terrier, Caesar, which followed his hearing at the king's funeral. "Poor little dog," said Mrs. Asquith to the queen. "His devotion to the king, madam, touched every spectator."

"Horrid little dog," replied the queen. "He never went near my poor husband when he was ill."

1045 AUTOS IN USE BY STATE

SALEM, Ore.—(UP)—How many automobiles does the state of Oregon own?

Exactly 1045. Passenger cars number 475, and commercial vehicles 550. The state spends thousands of dollars annually for new machines. Ninety-two automobiles were purchased in 1931, 115 in 1932, and 108 have been purchased so far this year.

This year's purchases include 60 Chevrolts, 40 Fords, 4 Buicks, and 1 Hudson. Nash, Plymouth and Dodge. Fifty-one of the cars were coaches, 36 coupes, and 21 of the sedan type.

Thirty-nine of the new machines were for the state police, and 21 for the highway department. Other users: Forestry department, 2; blind employers institute, 1; labor, 3; state department, 8; engineer, 1; Oregon state college, 4; industrial accident, 13; eastern Oregon state hospital, 1; agriculture, 13; boys' training school, 1; and veterans' bureau, 4.

HUCKLEBERRIES BASIS OF MANY PLEASING DISHES

Oregon huckleberries may be served fresh at this season in many delicious dishes or stored away for next winter in the form of fruit juice, jam, conserve, jelly or canned, reminds Lucy A. Case, extension nutrition specialist at O. S. C. The evergreen huckleberry, whose glossy foliage is commonly used by florists, produces a delicious small berry.

Among other edible varieties are the large black huckleberries, "little blacks," which grow at higher altitudes, and the red huckleberries which are found in the deep woods. The reds make excellent jam.

Huckleberries are a valuable source of mineral and roughage in the diet and their delicacy of flavor is long to be remembered when used in pies, sauce, muffins, griddle cakes, waffles, steamed pudding, cottage pudding, upside-down cake, sherbet, mousse, punch and other delicious combinations," says Miss Case.

Miss Claribel Nye, state leader of home economics extension, has gathered desirable huckleberry recipes, has had them tested, and copies can be obtained free of charge from any county extension agent or the state college at Corvallis. Ask for HE 382, "The Evergreen Huckleberry." A recipe for huckleberry cream pie, recently received from Alaska, follows:

Huckleberry Cream Pie.
Fill baked pastry shell with a cream filling made as follows:
1 1/2 cups milk
1/4 cup flour
1/2 cup sugar
1/4 teaspoon salt
2 eggs.
Put milk in top of double boiler. Mix sugar and flour and add to the milk. Cook until thick. Add egg yolks and salt and beat until smooth. Pour into the pie crust, cover with 1 cup fresh sweetened huckleberries. Beat the egg whites and add 2 tablespoons sugar. Spread over the berries and brown slightly in a medium oven.

PITTSBURGH, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Pledging "fidelity, submission and obedience" to the line of Peter the Apostle—first bishop of Christendom—the Most Reverend Ralph Leo Hayes today was created a bishop in the Catholic church.


After the reading of a papal bull from Pope Pius XI, designating him bishop of Helena, Mont., the cleric, still remembered by many Pittsburghers as a barefoot boy, and later as a crack infielder on the Duquesne university baseball team, was invested with crozier, ring and mitre, symbols of his office.

Bishop Hayes was 49 years old today.
