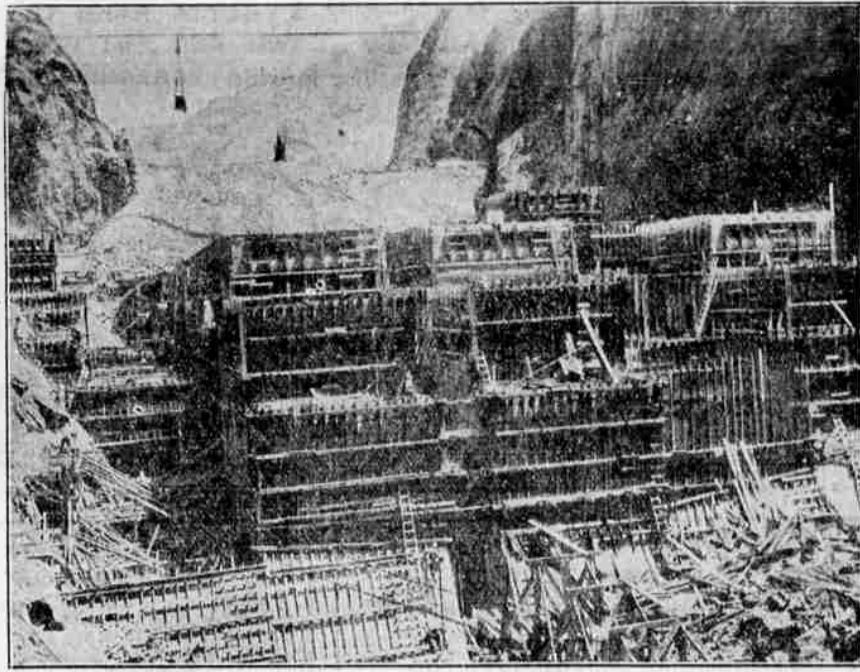


FIRE DESTROYS BOAT RACE ENTRY



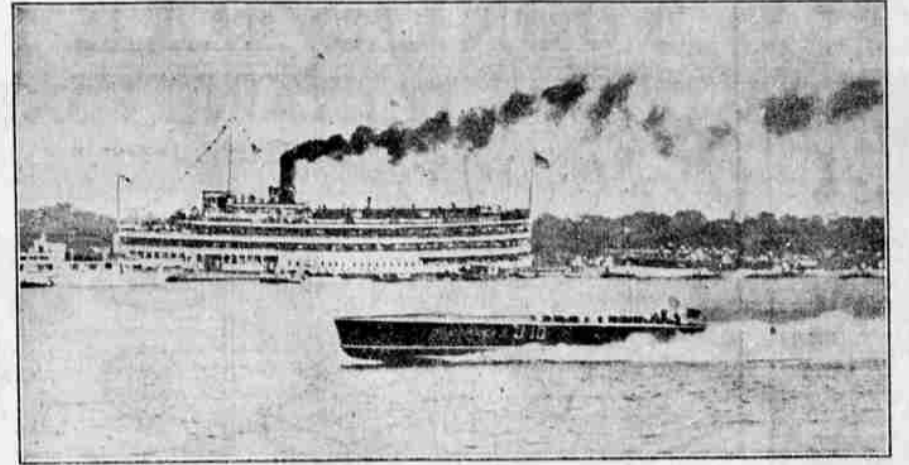

CAR IS SUBMERGED IN VIRGINIA FLOOD WATERS



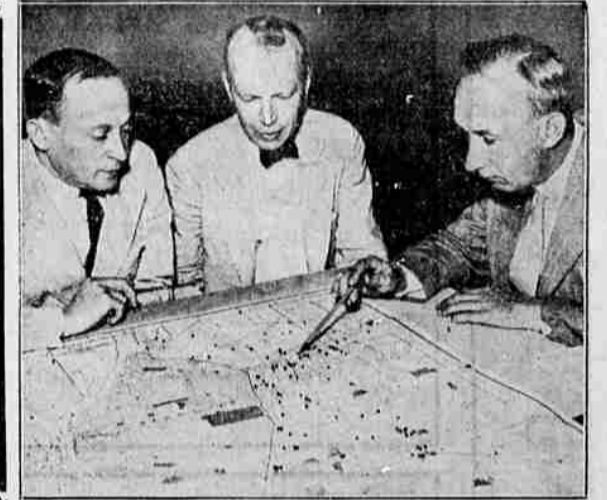

STAR CENTURY SPRINTER WEDS

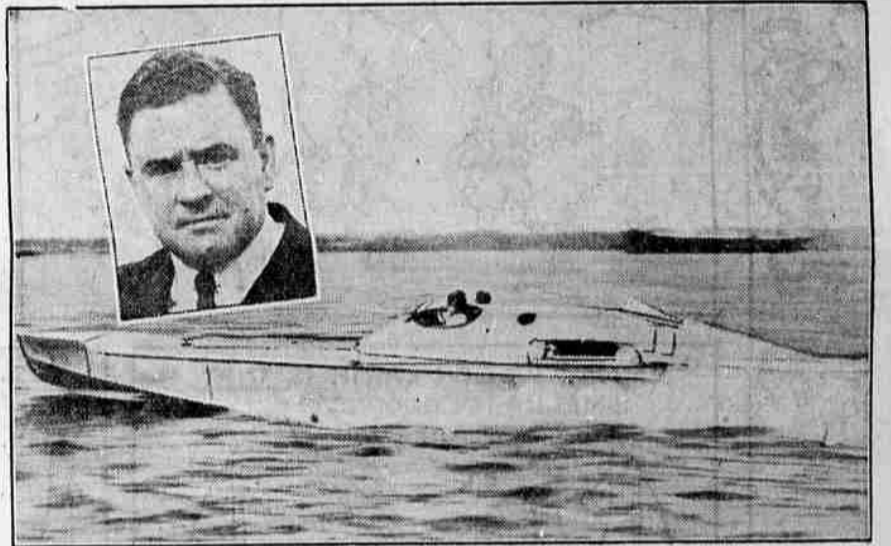
