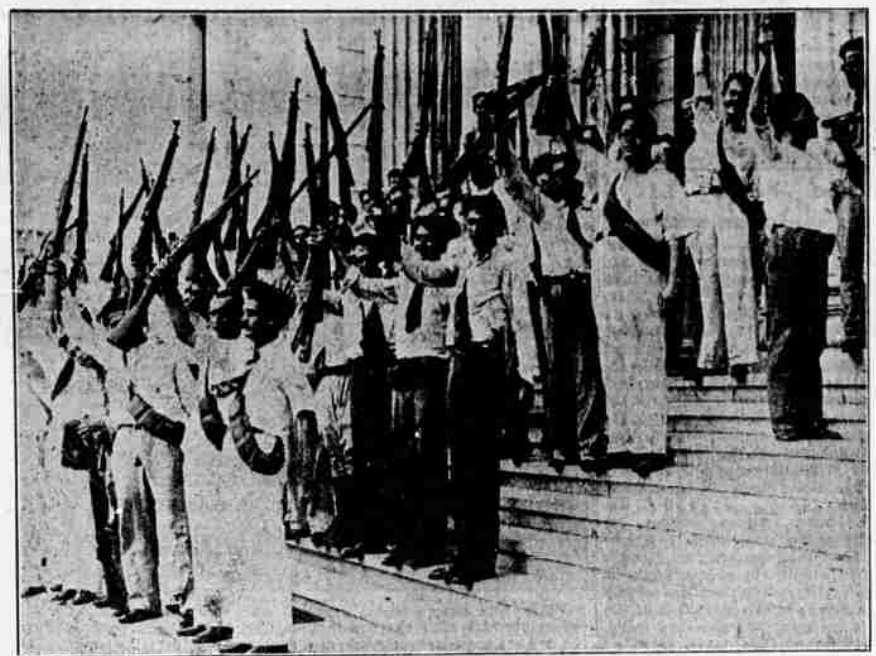

Menus of the Day

By Mrs. Alexander George TOMATO AND CELERY RELISH A Dinner Menu Sliced Roast Veal Tomato and Celery Relish

Creamed Peas Honolulu Conserve Molded Cottage Cheese Lettuce Tomatoes and Celery Relish 12 cups chopped tomatoes 6 cups chopped celery 4 cups chopped red peppers 4 cups chopped green peppers 3 tablespoons salt 4 tablespoons white mustard seed 2 tablespoons celery seed 2 1/2 cups sugar, brown 2 cups vinegar 1 stick bark cinnamon 1 teaspoon whole allspice 18 whole cloves Mix spices and tie in white muslin bag. Add to rest of ingredients and simmer 2 hours or until relish thickens. Remove spice bag, pour relish in sterilized jars, seal at once.

Homolulu Conserve 3 pounds seeded plums 2 cups raisins 4 cups pineapple 1 cup pineapple juice 1/2 cup lemon juice 1/2 cup orange juice 8 cups sugar Mix plums, raisins, pineapple and juices and cook slowly 25 minutes. Add rest of ingredients, simmer until thick and jelly-like. Pour into sterilized jars, when cool seal with melted paraffin. Fresh or canned pineapple may be used and if desired one cup of shredded almonds may be added.

Molded Cottage Cheese 1 package lemon-flavored gelatin mixture 1 1/2 cups boiling water 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon paprika 1 teaspoon lemon juice 1 tablespoon sugar 1 cup cottage cheese 1/4 cup chopped sweet pickles 8 pimiento stuffed olives, chopped Pour boiling water over gelatin mixture, stir until dissolved. Cool. Add rest of ingredients. Pour into small molds which have been rinsed out of cold water. Set in cold place to stiffen. Unmold on lettuce, top with salad dressing or mayonnaise. Add a little chopped mint to baked apples for flavoring.

Creole Corn, Serving 3 (Uses Leftovers) 3 tablespoons bacon fat 3 tablespoons chopped onion 3 tablespoons chopped green peppers 1/4 teaspoon salt 2 cups leftover cooked corn 1 egg yolk 3 tablespoons cream 1/4 teaspoon sugar 1/4 teaspoon paprika Heat fat in frying pan. Add and brown onion and peppers. Add salt and corn. Cook 5 minutes, stirring frequently. Add rest of the ingredients, cook one minute. Serve.

Butterscotch Buns 2 cups flour 4 teaspoons baking powder 1/4 teaspoon salt 2-3 cup milk 2-3 cup dark brown sugar 4 tablespoons butter 1 teaspoon vanilla Mix ingredients. Sprinkle small portions in bottoms of 10 muffin pans, spread rest on top soft dough, roll up like jelly roll, cut off 1/4 inch slices and place flat side up in muffin pans. Bake 15 minutes in moderate oven. Serve warm with butter.
