At Ince, in northern Nye county, Mrs. Albert Dunnin is assisting her husband in developing a mine. She twists the crank of the windlass and hoists the ore and muck which her husband breaks down at the bottom of the shaft.

Jimmy Hinton and his young wife, Helen, are mining at Lida. They are accomplished musicians and play one or two nights a week at an Alkali Springs resort to secure money for supplies for their mining operations. Mrs. Hinton was formerly on the Orpheum circuit.

"There is a lot of difference between tapping piano keys and turning the crank of a windlass," this pretty sun-kissed miner said, laughingly.

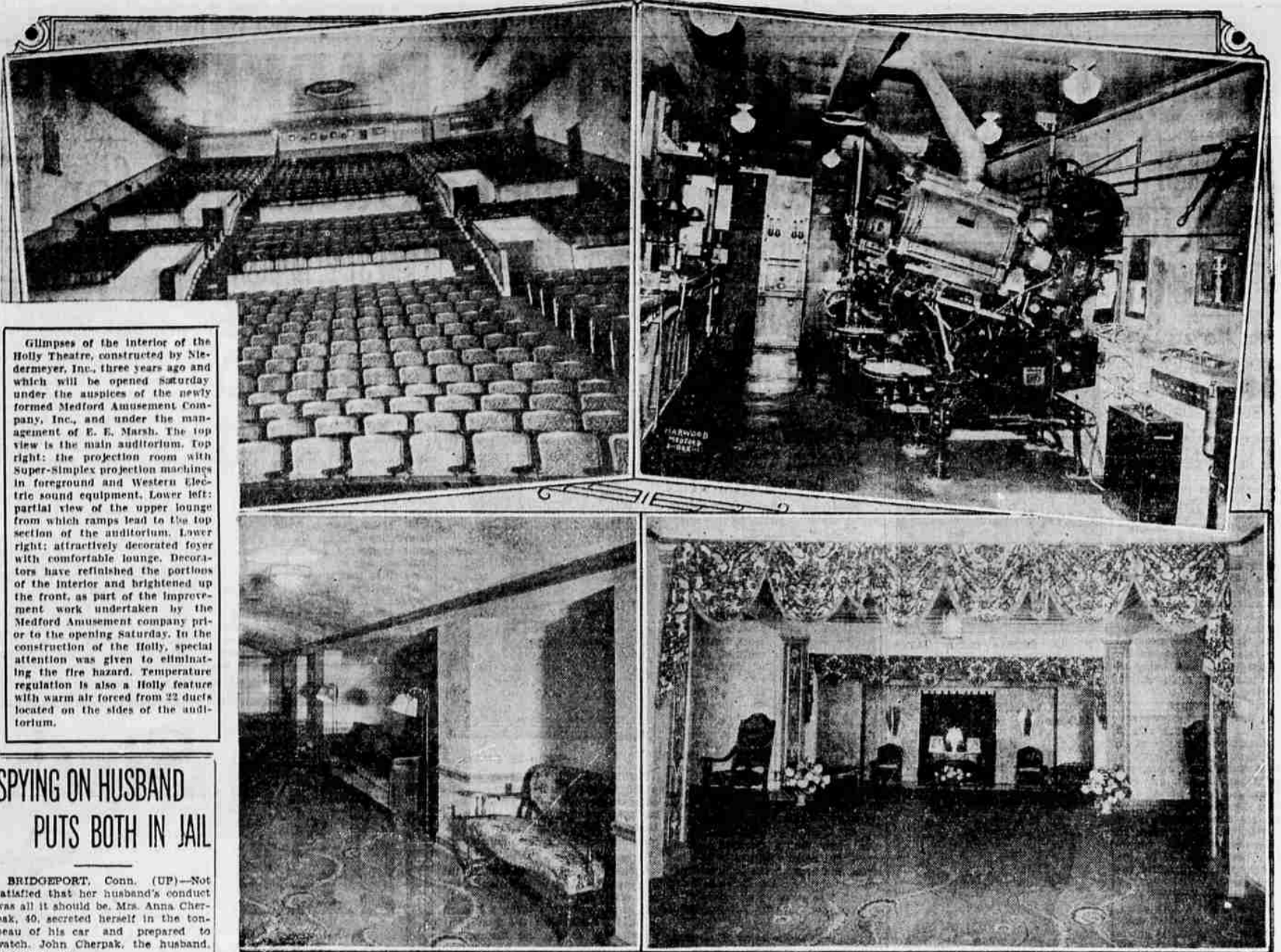
Out at Hannipah, Mrs. Ben Richardson has been assisting her husband for several years in developing a high-grade silver property.
