## LOANS ON WINTER WHEAT OBTAINABLE UPON APPLICATION

Henry Morgenthau, Jr., governor of the Farm Credit Administration, has announced through L. J. Paulson, regional manager of the Farm Credit Administration crop production loan office at Minneapolis, Minn., that loans for winter wheat production will be granted in all states which normally produce winter wheat. Loan application forms are now being distributed to authorized field inspectors and county feed and seed loan committees.

Regulations closely follow those of other crop loans requiring a first lien on the crop to be seeded, with a note maturing August 31, 1934. Loans will be limited to a maximum of \$300.

Farmers interested in obtaining a loan should immediately get in touch with the authorized field inspector for the Minneapolis office, who is George Hilton, Jr., located at Grants Pass, Ore., or the county seed loan committee. This committee is contributing its services without pay or fee of any sort and is to be commended for its unselfish efforts in behalf of this community. The Jackson county feed and seed loan committee consists of R. G. Fowler, county agent; Eugene Thordick, Geo. E. Dean and J. R. McCracken.

## GRIZZLY MONARCH OF YELLOWSTONE KILLED TO HALT CABIN RAIDS

COLUMBUS, Mont. (UP)—The reign of terror by Scarface, a giant grizzly bear, has ended.

Once the king of Yellowstone Park grizzlies, Scarface had descended to a series of raids along the Boulder River. Measuring 18 inches between the ears and weighing more than 1,000 pounds, the great bear robbed a total of 17 cabins in less than a month.

Ripping window sashes with his giant claws, or bursting through doorways by the sheer force of his great weight, Scarface left an unequalled trail of wreckage and depredation.

Ranchers vainly tried to corner him. Traps were set, only to be smashed, or carefully avoided. Finally, three government hunters were called in.

The bear walked into a trap set by the hunters the first night they took up the chase. Pulling it with him, Scarface retreated up a canyon. There the hunters found him, anylonger, enraged, ready to kill any who approached. Four shots ended him.

Scared by innumerable conflicts, one eye torn out, nearly toothless, his hide ragged and torn, the grizzly had been forced to raid cabins to gain food, government authorities said. If he had succeeded in continuing his depredations, the bear sooner or later would have entered an occupied cabin, it was said.

## WIDOW OF PIPES PASSES, AGED 77

PORTLAND, Sept. 29.—(AP)—Mary C. Pipes, 77, widow of the late Judge Martin L. Pipes, died at her home here last night. Judge Pipes, one of the best known attorneys in the state, died in July, 1932.

Mrs. Pipes was born in Alabama in 1856, and married Judge Pipes in that state in 1874. A few months later the two came to Oregon, settling near Independence. Later they moved to Corvallis, and in 1892 they came to Portland.

Three sons and two daughters survive. Other surviving relatives include two brothers, the Rev. Walton Skipworth of Portland and Judge W. E. Skipworth of Eugene, and Mrs. Edna B. Wood of Monmouth, a sister.

## LARGE BEAR KILLED WMS. CREEK DISTRICT

WILLIAMS CREEK, Sept. 29.—(Sp.)—The large brown bear, which has been molesting the orchards and sheep corrals and pig pens for the last two years on the left fork of Williams creek recently met his fate at the hands of a Mr. Mullen one evening last week. It was discovered by Mr. Mullen feasting on apples and while his small daughter held a flashlight, Mr. Mullen killed him. It took two shots. When dressed he weighed over 400 pounds.

## MRS. ROOSEVELT AND OTHERS GIVEN MONEY FOR ENDORSEMENTS

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Sept. 29.—(AP)—Testimony that Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1930 accepted \$1,000 from an advertising agency to endorse furniture manufactured by Berkey & Gray Co. of Grand Rapids, was introduced today in the federal court suit of receivers for the company against the Simmons Co. of New York.

Invoices of the advertising agency which contained the reference to Mrs. Roosevelt also listed other prominent women as having accepted money for such endorsements.

Among them were Mrs. Graham Fair Vanderbilt of New York, as having received \$2,000; Mrs. A. J. Drexel Biddle of Philadelphia, \$750, and Mrs. J. Borden Harriman, New York, \$1,000.

Attorney Joseph Amber for the plaintiffs explained "These exhibits are submitted to cite the policy of the Simmons Co."
