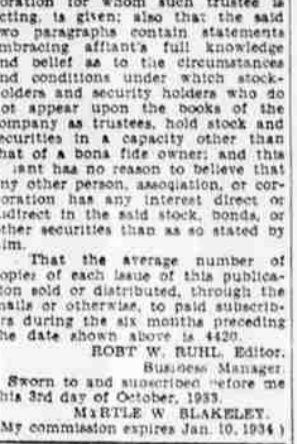

WESTERN BANKS SHOW CONTINUED BUSINESS GAINS

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 3.—(AP)—Further moderate expansion in business loans, additions to banking reserves and gains in demand deposits stood out today as the chief features of the weekly report of the Federal Reserve bank of San Francisco on the condition of large reporting banks of the west.

For 33 banks in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Salt Lake City, Spokane, Seattle, Tacoma and Portland, aggregate business loans rose \$2,000,000 during the week, totaling \$576,000,000. This is still under the \$727,000,000 of a year ago, but the gradual expansion of the last two months has added \$19,000,000 to the flow of funds in industrial channels.

Demand deposits rose \$7,000,000 during the week, totaling \$571,000,0
