

1934 BUDGET ESTIMATES—JACKSON COUNTY

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 8, Chapter 446 of the 1933 Session Laws of Oregon, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, will meet at the Court House, in Medford, Oregon, on Wednesday, the 1st day of November, A. D. 1933, at the hour of 10:30 o'clock A. M. of said day and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimates of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year as published here- by, by any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interests of Jackson County.

The County Budget Committee for Jackson County, Oregon, has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of County government, County office or County officer, each County improvement, the maintenance of each County building, structure or institution, the salary of each County officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and main- tenance of public highways, roads, bridges, the construction, operation and maintenance of each public utility and redemption of outstanding warrants, the estimate of the public receipts of the County from sources other than direct taxation upon real and personal property in the County during the period for which such tax is to be levied and an estimate of the probable unappropriated and unexpended balances in the funds of the County on the last day of the current year.

Byrd's Pilot: For injuries received in action October 9, 1918, when he was a private in Company B of the First Engineers, Charles W. Johnson of this city has received the award of the Purple Heart from the United States War Department. It was announced today, Mr. Johnson lives out in the country from Medford and was one of the great army of men sent out by the United States to see action in practically all fighting sectors of the World War. He was shell shocked and suffered other injuries, which make life far from pleasant today.

His record in action includes: Anasville defensive sector; Cantigny defensive sector with the 16th Infantry; Montdidier-Rayon with the First Engineers; Cantigny defensive sector; Salsens and Anasville defensive sectors, and participation in St. Mihiel and Meuse Argonne offensive.
