There are about 300 other players, featured actors and lesser stars, and perhaps 50 directors whose average weekly wage is in the neighborhood of \$1,000.

Several stars—Wili Rogers, Richard Barthelmess and Richard Dix—are paid by the picture. Rogers is said to get \$125,000 for each film, making two a year. Barthelmess, who formerly got \$300,000 a year for two pictures, this year will be paid the same amount for three films. Dix is said to get \$100,000 for each film. He stars in three annually.

Constance Bennett, who recently signed a contract which will pay her a percentage of the profits of her pictures, last year received nearly a half million dollars for her cinematic efforts. Her 40 weeks' contract with R. K. O. gave her \$7,500 weekly and she got an extra check for \$150,000 from Warners for one picture. The previous year she also made a Warner picture for the same salary.

Greta Garbo's salary is said to be about \$100,000 a week for 32 weeks. Ann Harding rates away up on the list. Her pay is said to be better than \$300,000 a year. Ramon Novarro, Joan Crawford, Wallace Beery, Marie Dressler and Jaynet Gaynor each get between \$3,000 and \$4,000 weekly.

The success of their pictures determines what the producer-stars, Charlie Chaplin, Mary Pickford and Harold Lloyd receive. Chaplin expects to gross about \$2,000 on his latest film, "Modern Times," whose personal fortune is estimated at \$4,000,000, is reported to make considerable profit on each of her ventures.

There are about 300 other players, featured actors and lesser stars, and perhaps 50 directors whose average weekly wage is in the neighborhood of \$1,000.

Several stars—Wili Rogers, Richard Barthelmess and Richard Dix—are paid by the picture. Rogers is said to get \$125,000 for each film, making two a year. Barthelmess, who formerly got \$300,000 a year for two pictures, this year will be paid the same amount for three films. Dix is said to get \$100,000 for each film. He stars in three annually.

Constance Bennett, who recently signed a contract which will pay her a percentage of the profits of her pictures, last year received nearly a half million dollars for her cinematic efforts. Her 40 weeks' contract with R. K. O. gave her \$7,500 weekly and she got an extra check for \$150,000 from Warners for one picture. The previous year she also made a Warner picture for the same salary.

Greta Garbo's salary is said to be about \$100,000 a week for 32 weeks. Ann Harding rates away up on the list. Her pay is said to be better than \$300,000 a year. Ramon Novarro, Joan Crawford, Wallace Beery, Marie Dressler and Jaynet Gaynor each get between \$3,000 and \$4,000 weekly.

The success of their pictures determines what the producer-stars, Charlie Chaplin, Mary Pickford and Harold Lloyd receive.
