**MINORS GET FILM CONTRACT O. K.**



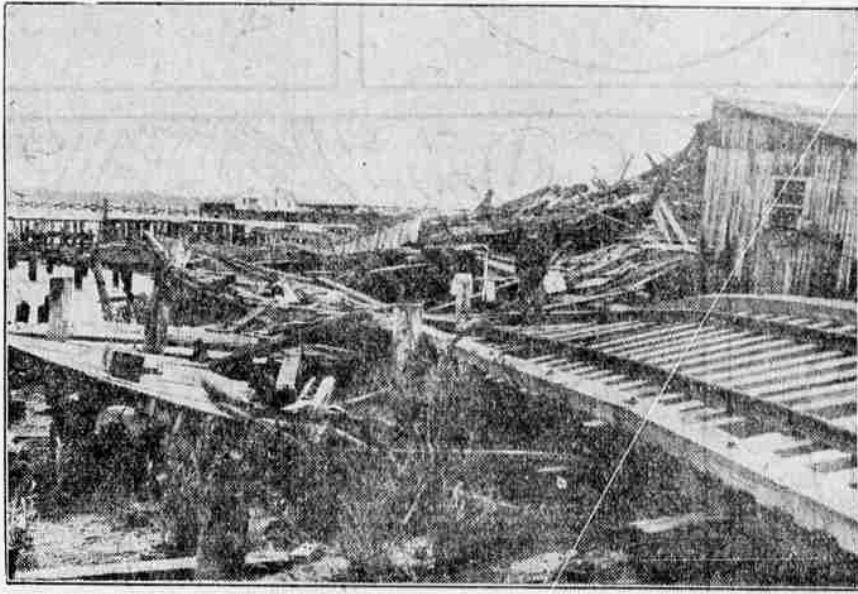

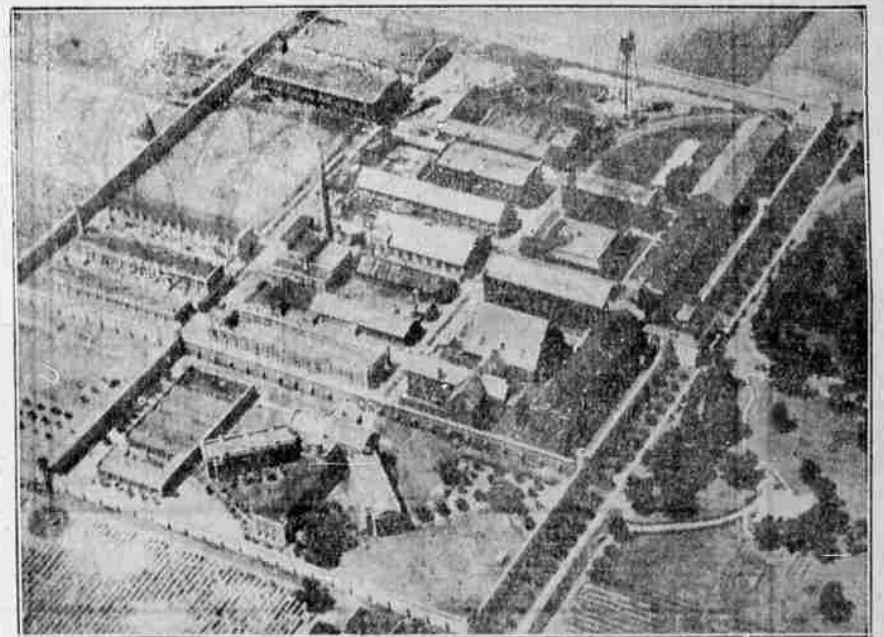
