RETAIL PRACTICE CODE DISCUSSED

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—(AP)—President Roosevelt in a series of conferences today heard the attitudes of several groups in their controversy over the retail fair practices code.

Among the conferees was Hugh S. Johnson, NIRA administrator, who said he had discussed the code with the president and added: "It's up to the president now."

He did not make clear at the White House, however, whether he had left the code with the president or whether his recommendations remained to be drawn.

The president also discussed the situation with a group of retailers who insisted the "stop-loss" provision should remain in the code as specified at present. The leader of this delegation was William H. Hager, president of the Retailers association of Pennsylvania.
