WOOL PRICE FIRM, BUT NO BUSINESS

BOSTON, Oct. 21.—(AP)—(U.S. D. A.)—Very little business is being transacted in the wool market. Nevertheless, the price situation appears mostly quite firm. The only weakness noticed recently has been on some specially scoured woolen wools, prices of which, on account of scarcity, had been advanced decidedly out of line with prices of other wools in the heavy September trading. Greasy wools, suitable for worsted manufacture are being firmly held and small quantities are moved at prices fully up to recent selling quotations.
