

CLASS DEBATES AT HIGH SCHOOL IN NEAR FUTURE

Sleeping Sickness or Pardon? Every Mosquito Bite Chance at Freedom For Convict Volunteers

JACKSON, Miss.—(AP)—A desperate game of chance, with their pardon a possible stake, is deciding the fate of 10 convicts who submitted themselves for tests to discover the cause of sleeping sickness.

The cards of the game were running their way at the end of the first week. It was then that examination disclosed no symptoms of the disease in the men who had allowed themselves to be bitten repeatedly by mosquitoes which previously had bitten monkeys inoculated with the virus.

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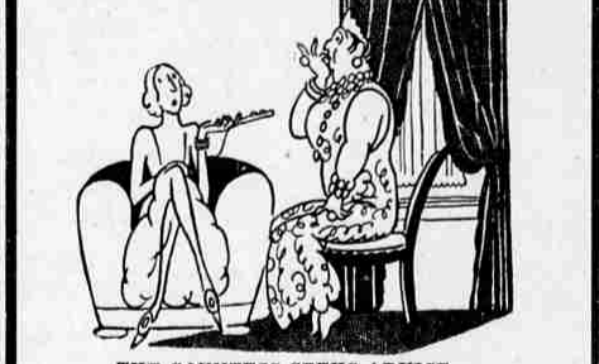
