

BUTTER AND EGGS CONTINUE STEADY IN PORTLAND MART

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 27.—(AP)—There was practically no change in the butter market situation for the day insofar as the open trade was concerned.

Make continued seasonably liberal and there was no shortage of fresh stock while the huge surplus of storage goods continued almost intact.

Trade in fresh eggs continued at least steady and generally without price changes for the last 24 hours.

Stocks were also easy. Great increase in sales of dry beans was reported during the last two days.

Much better quality lettuce was arriving from The Dalles sector and a liberal increase in the supply was shown for the day.

Potatoes were a trifle dull but unchanged in price. Onion market continued weak with Yakima hitting prices.

Green beans are getting scarce; a trifle firmer. Cauliflower was weak locally and for carlots.

YOUNG TURKEYS SPOILING MARKET

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 27.—(AP)—A movement into the Portland market of immature turkeys was chief by the Journal today to be the chief factor in forcing prices downward.

Estimates indicated that all but a mere fraction of the supply now reaching the market is below top grade, the paper continued.
