# The Slaughter of Elk

OVER the protests of eastern Oregon sportsmen, an open season on elk was declared by the last Oregon Legislature.

What these sportsmen said would happen, has happened. The elk were slaughtered like rabbits. Affadavits have been pouring into headquarters of the state game commission, show-

ing that not 30 per cent of the elk killed were ever brought in. The carcasses are rotting in the wilderness, and there is no attempt to estimate the number of wounded animals, dragging themselves around to die lingering deaths, or become helpless victims of predatory animals.
