

# MONEY MEDDLING CARRIES DANGER PROFS. DECLARE

Midwest University Experts  
Call for Swift and Public  
Dissent From Radical  
Coin Experimentation

CHICAGO, Nov. 3. — (AP) — Twelve midwest university professors versed in economics, money and banking, today called for a "swift and public dissent to what they termed "radical experimentation with our currency" by the national administration.

They declared in a statement published in the Daily News that the administration's monetary policy is at error because "the gold content of the dollar is relatively unimportant in general price restoration when compared with bank credit actively at work."

"It is now assumed in Washington that the price of gold and the price of other commodities move automatically in the same direction," the statement said. "And apparently that there is too much gold in the dollar to get the benefits of a higher price level."

**Gold Complicated.**  
"The relationship of gold to prices is complicated and indirect. It is a sobering thought that the 1928 price level was based on a gold dollar of the old weight. The high prices of 1926 were not due to manipulation of the gold weight of the dollar, but were dependent upon a broad use of bank credit."

"Tinkering with the monetary unit will not remedy deep-seated economic maladjustments."  
"Individual enterprise can not be encouraged by erratic changes in fundamental costs or by unpredictable fluctuations in the value of money," the statement continued.

"There is no point in insisting on a return to the old gold parity, but a scheme to depreciate the dollar to uncertain limits by the deliberate use of government influence does not inspire confidence."

**Return of Gold Needed.**  
They suggested a return to a modernized gold standard with explicit agreements concerning the rules of management. They said such a return to gold would provide "ample room for sound experimentation with our monetary institutions."

"The establishment of confidence in the monetary unit is only a first step toward recovery," the statement said. "The maintenance of national credit unimpaired and the assurance of a smooth flow of investment funds to satisfy the capital needs of enterprise are further steps in the restoration of business and employment."

The statement was signed by Professors James Washington Bell, F. S. Deibler, Ralph E. Hellman and Horace Secrist of Northwestern University; Garfield V. Cox, Harry D. Gidcoose, H. A. Mills of the University of Chicago, William H. Klekhofer of the University of Wisconsin, J. Leo Scharfman of the University of Michigan, A. B. Wolfe of Ohio State University, and Ivan Wright of the University of Illinois.

## Groceria Has Room For Huge Store Of Beef

A large refrigerated meat room with a capacity of 36 beefs is now in operation at the west side store of the Groceria Super Food Markets, according to W. A. Gates. A five-ton refrigerating machine cools this large room, which is maintained at a temperature varying from 33 to 35 degrees through a thermoelastic control. This system is also complete with automatic defrosting.

Beef that is sold by the Groceria Super Food Markets will be held in this cooling room from 12 to 21 days so that the "fresh" meat taste will be done away with.

Patrons of the Groceria Super Food Markets have been advised by Mr. Gates and Mr. Lydiard to inspect this cooling room so that they may see how beef is handled before being cut and placed in the Webber displaying cases, equipped with Frigid-air cooling.
