WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—The removal of the fleet to the Atlantic was merely to help the lonesome sailors' sweethearts in eastern ports.

No one can doubt the official announcement to that effect. The fact has been in the Pacific for three years. That is too long for any sailor to be away from his sweetheart.

But it does not explain why the announcement was made six months ahead of time and almost on the eve of the arrival of M. Litvinoff. There is a better explanation for that.

PUPILS, PARENTS BEHIND FACULTY IN OUSTER MOVE

Higher Education Board Chairman Target for Concentrated Fire—Claim Action Needed for Harmony

EUGENE, Ore., Nov. 7.—(AP)—The University of Oregon faculty, its student body, the Oregon dads, the Oregon mothers and the University of Oregon federation were united in demanding the resignation of Roscoe C. Nelson, president of the state board of higher education, today following adoption of resolutions and receipt of telegrams from alumni officials here last night.

A petition endorsing the faculty resolution was circulated among students of the university and bore 1024 signatures last night. A committee of 50 students, headed by Thomas H. Tongue, Hillsboro, president of the associated students, was appointed yesterday to draw up the resolution, which was submitted to all living groups and independent students.

Telegrams from W. Lair Thompson, Portland, president of the Oregon Dads; Harriet M. Dible, Portland, president of the Oregon Mothers; and Edie Wellington, Portland, president of the University Federation, all expressed full support of the faculty's action. Thompson's telegram stated: "Now harmony can be obtained by a major operation, the board should perform it immediately."

In a front page editorial this morning the Oregon Emerald, student newspaper, answered the statement of E. R. Byrson, Eugene attorney, who said the board should be reformed.

HEAVY VOTE SEEN AS STATES VOICE WISHES ON REPEAL
COLUMBIA, S. C., Nov. 7.—(AP)—Anti-repeal forces carried the first box to report in South Carolina's referendum today on repeal of the 18th amendment by more than a 3 to 1 majority. The precinct was Bon Avon, a suburb of Spartanburg, and gave 5 votes for repeal and 28 against.
