

NEW YORK STATE WINERIES READY FOR DRY REPEAL

Twenty Million Gallons In Storehouses Await Zero Hour — Expect Reasonable Prices Will Prevail

BUFFALO, N. Y.—(UP)—Some 20 million gallons of wines and champagnes, some 32 years old, are ready for distribution by the fineries of central and western New York.

In the Finger Lakes region, where more than two-score wineries have been operating in anticipation of repeal, it is estimated that 17 million gallons are ready.

Approximately a million bottles of champagne are available in the district. In the heyday of its prosperity the United States consumed about two million bottles of American-made champagne annually. Of this amount three-fourths was made in the Finger Lakes area.

Although they said it was almost impossible to predict prices, winery operators believe the price will not be out of the reach of the average pocketbook.

One winery head, who asked that his name be withheld, said he believed the retail price of a quart of wine would not be more than \$1.50. Good champagnes probably will be available at between \$3.50 and \$5 a quart.

It is estimated that the average age of the wine, which will be available from the New York wineries, will be well over four years.

Upwards of 350,000 gallons of wine from the Chautauqua-Erie grape belt will be available. Only four wineries in the district, the nation's largest producing area for the American type grape, are operating.

Port, sherry and claret are the most important varieties made in the belt. The Chautauqua and Erie Grape Growers association expects to press 150,000 gallons of wine this season, and if its plans are realized, the total amount of wine available from the district would reach the 500,000 gallon mark.

In the Hornell district, six big wineries, whose products were famous before prohibition, have reopened.

FIVE KILLINGS IN KENTUCKY BALLOT

PRESTONBURG, Ky., Nov. 9.—Reports of five election day killings in Floyd and Knott counties were received here today, bringing to 15 the number of such killings in Kentucky.

Two men were slain, another probably fatally stabbed and three others wounded slightly in Floyd county.

Arthur Thompson, who was shot here Tuesday, died today in a Martin hospital. Dennis Spears, 18, also died in the Martin hospital.

Stabbed in the lung, Frank Burchett, 27, was believed fatally wounded in a Floyd county fight blamed by officers on a drinking bout.

Reports from Hindman said Ballard and Orville Hall, cousins, and a man named Mullins were shot to death in Knott county Tuesday in a fight.

MUNICIPAL POWER PROJECTS VOTED

(By the Associated Press) Proposals involving more than \$31,500,000 for municipal power and other utility projects were approved in election Tuesday in widely separated cities, while like projects involving several millions were voted down in six municipalities.

The largest projects approved were in San Francisco, with bond issues of \$30,500,000 for five city projects conditioned on grants from the federal public works administration.

Camden, N. J., approved construction of a \$10,000,000 municipal light plant by a vote of 2 1/2 to 1, and Columbus, Ohio, voters on the basis of incomplete figures appeared to have approved a bond issue of more than \$1,000,000 to expand the municipal light plant.
