## CLAIRE WINDSOR WINS NEW TRIAL

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 11—(AP)—The \$75,000 judgment awarded Mrs. Marian Y. Read, of Oakland, against Claire Windsor, actress, over the love of Alfred C. Reed, Jr., former broker, has been set aside and a new trial granted the actress.

In a brief opinion given late yesterday, Superior Judge J. P. Sproul declared the verdict was so grossly excessive and unreasonable as to indicate the jurors had been swayed by passion and prejudice.

"Under the circumstances disclosed in the record in this case," read the court's opinion, "I am constrained to hold that the verdict in the sum of \$75,000 was so excessive and unreasonable as to raise a presumption of prejudice and passion."

The judge stated also that new evidence had been discovered by the defendant in the suit and declared that "the ends of justice would best be served by granting a new trial."
