

SCARLET FEVER CASES REPORTED

Seven cases of scarlet fever under quarantine in Medford were reported today by Dr. L. D. Inskip, health officer. There are a number of additional cases in precincts neighboring Medford and health officers today asked that all persons watch carefully for symptoms of the disease, as many very light cases transfer the fever to others, who become seriously ill with it.

Sore throats and slight rashes particularly are to be watched, as these are often the only indications of the disease persons have. More complications than usual, however are resulting from the disease this year, Dr. Inskip stated yesterday, emphasizing the need to avoid the contagion. Cases have been reported in Jacksonville, Talent and the Oak Grove district.
