ELKS BRIDGE TOURNEY IS SCHEDULED DEC. 1ST

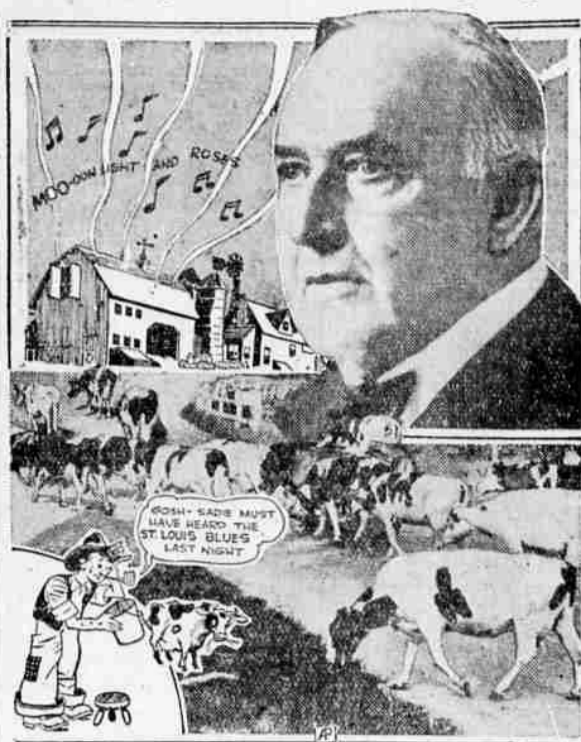
