HOG PROCESSING TAX OBLIGATORY PRODUCERS TOLD

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 24.—(UP)—Oregon farmers were today notified by J. W. Maloney, collector of internal revenue, that the hog-processing tax is in effect and must be paid on all hogs slaughtered for the market. Killing is the first process a hog goes through in reaching market. A tax of 50 cents a hundred pounds of live animal must be paid by each farmer or butcher who kills a hog for the market during November.

Proceeds will be used to pay reduction benefits to farmers contracting to reduce their swine herds. Other processing taxes will be levied on lard, cured meats, sausages and other products derived partially or wholly from hogs. Wholesale distributors must file inventory of such commodities as of November 5. Retailers will be given until December 5. Persons or firms holding taxable commodities not for sale as such, like lard stored at a bakery or hotel, must file their inventory as of November 5.
