

FRENCH CABINET OUSTED AGAIN IN PARTY BATTLING

Georges Bonnet and Camille Chautemps Mentioned for Premiership — Fear for Franco in Rapid Changes

PARIS, Nov. 24.—(AP)—Two different names for the next premier of France to succeed Albert Sarraut, overthrown last night, were rumored in two distinct circles of the government today.

Official sources said they expected President Lebrun to ask Georges Bonnet, minister of finance in the late cabinet, to take the premiership, and in the lobby of the chamber of deputies it was said Camille Chautemps, minister of the interior, might be called to power.

Danger to Franco Seen.

Lebrun is known to admire Bonnet and was said to be hopeful of a quick selection of a competent financial cabinet in order to avert danger from the franc.

Friends of Edouard Herriot, former premier, insisted that the time was not ripe for his resumption of power.

Through the lobby of the chamber of deputies, which has overthrown three cabinets already this year, ran the prediction that Lebrun would offer the premiership to Herriot as a courtesy, that Herriot would refuse, and that then the president would turn to Camille Chautemps, minister of the interior in the Sarraut cabinet.

Herriot's Health Poor.

Herriot was said to be sure to refuse because of his health—he has just recovered from a serious three-months' illness—and a dislike for being in the ministry on December 15, the anniversary of France's default on payment of its war debts to the United States when he was premier.

Chautemps, it was said, plans a resurrection of the cartel, believing he would receive the support of the socialists and fearing an eventual "public safety" cabinet otherwise.

A "public safety" cabinet already has been called for by Deputy Emilio Morand, under-secretary of physical education in former Premier Laval's ministry. Morand asked all republicans to support such a government to restore French finances as did the late Raymond Poincare in 1926.

Solid Government Needed.

Alarmed French leaders told President Lebrun that it was imperative to have a solid government to protect the franc and end national instability.

A wave of resentment at the succeeding cabinet was reflected by Jules Jeanneney and Joseph Caillaux, who after Premier Sarraut's government had been overthrown early this morning, said "it was a crime to overthrow the government under present circumstances."

"I think," M. Jeanneney told the president, "that it is about time that the slaughter of ministers ought to cease. The fate of the franc is more important than party contests."

POSTMASTER EXAMS TO FILL VACANCIES

Yellow Cake
1/2 cup butter.
1 1/2 cups sugar.
1 cup milk.
1 teaspoon vanilla.
1/2 teaspoon lemon extract.
1/2 teaspoon almond extract.
1/2 teaspoon salt.
3 egg yolks, beaten.
3 cups pastry flour.
3 teaspoons baking powder.
3 egg whites, beaten.
Cream butter and sugar. Add milk, extracts, salt, yolks, flour and baking powder. Beat 2 minutes. Fold in egg whites. Pour batter into 2 layer cake pans lined with waxed paper. Bake 25 minutes in moderately slow oven. Cool and frost.
Sea Foam Frosting
1 1/2 cups dark brown sugar.
1/2 teaspoon salt.
2 tablespoons cold water.
2 egg whites, beaten.
1 teaspoon vanilla.
1/2 cup nuts.
Mix sugar, salt and water in upper part of double boiler. Stir well. Place upper part into lower part of boiler which has been one-third filled with hot water. Place over moderate fire and add egg whites. Use rotary egg beater and beat 7

minutes or until frosting will form in peaks. Remove upper part of boiler from stove. Add vanilla and beat until creamy and cold. Frost cake. Sprinkle with nuts.

Date Coffee Bread
1 1/2 cups flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
4 tablespoons sugar
1/2 cup chopped dates
4 tablespoons fat
1/2 cup milk
1 egg
4 tablespoons butter
1-3 cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon.
Mix flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Add dates and cut in fat. Add milk and egg and pour soft dough into a greased shallow pan. Mix rest of ingredients and spread on top dough. Bake 20 minutes in moderate oven, cut into bars and serve.
Celery Soup.
1 cup sliced celery
1 tablespoon chopped onion
2 cups water
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon paprika
3 tablespoons butter
3 tablespoons flour

3 cups milk
1 teaspoon chopped parsley.
Mix celery, onion, water and salt. Cover and cook slowly 20 minutes. Press through strainer. Melt butter and add flour, when blended add milk and cook until creamy sauce forms. Add seasonings and strained celery mixture, cook 2 minutes.

LUMBER INDUSTRY SHOWS HUGE GAIN

PORTLAND, Nov. 24.—(AP)—New business amounting to 75,968,000, about 81 per cent above the three-year weekly average for November, and 43 per cent more than for the previous week, was reported by the Western Pine Association today for the week ending November 18. Of the 148 mills reporting, 81 were operating.

Shipments were 39,368,000 feet, and production 41,368,000 feet, putting production at 26 per cent of capacity,

compared with 27 per cent for the previous week and 23 per cent for the year to date. Current orders were 47 per cent of sawmill capacity.

For the year to date orders have increased about 10 per cent, shipments 3 per cent, and production 23 per cent over the 1932 totals for the same period.
