A Great Newspaper

THE Christian Science Monitor is celebrating its 25th anniversary. Copies of the anniversary edition, including an attractive rotogravure section, are coming to this desk, during the period of the celebration.

It is always a delight to look over the Monitor. It is undoubtedly one of the best newspapers in the world today, combining a very comprehensive survey of world events, with attractive features and penetrating editorial comment.

In fact the Monitor is unique in this respect—it is a successful international daily, which has very definite ideals of journalism and LIVES up to them.

"Why can't we have more newspapers like the Christian Science Monitor?" is a question frequently asked of the newspaper man.

THE answer is there is only a limited field for the international daily. There is also only a limited field for the newspaper that in its columns doesn't represent this whirling ball of dirt, we call the world, as it REALLY is, but as we wish it were.

The Christian Science Monitor only prints what might be termed pleasant news, and people who only wish pleasant news prefer it above all others.

But such people, take the world, by and large are in a decided minority. The majority want to know what's happening, they want the bad with the good, "with no regard for friends or foes, I trace the world exactly as it goes."

There is therefore no place in the world of journalism for ANOTHER international daily like the Christian Science Monitor. But there is a place for more newspapers that follow its example, have high ideals of the profession and stick to them.

Written in Blood

THE big west will not tolerate kidnaping. The warning has been issued. The lynching at San Jose of the two fiends who kidnaped and murdered young Hart is that warning.

Lynching is wrong. It is government by the mob. It is the code of the beak and talons and the bloody maw.

But an outraged and insulted populace distrusted the post-ponements and delays and miscarriages of the law. Six thousand citizens feared that the punishment of the two fiends would not be swift enough and sure enough to constitute a warning to other human wolves contemplating the new crime of abduction and extortion.

There is no other way than to attribute to the failures of law enforcement the blame for the California lynching. Seventeen days before, the kidnapers had confessed. The described to the authorities how they beat and brutally slew the boy. The facts that they were the killers, that Hart was their victim, that civilization had been insulted and a family crucified, were all established days before.

But an outraged and insulted populace distrusted the post-ponements and delays and miscarriages of the law. Six thousand citizens feared that the punishment of the two fiends would not be swift enough and sure enough to constitute a warning to other human wolves contemplating the new crime of abduction and extortion.

Accordingly, there was a lynching, at which justice was meted out to the kidnaping fiends. It is a warning to law-enforcing authorities in Oregon. It is a warning to the legislature of Oregon. That body at the last session rejected the appeal of the district attorneys of Oregon for a constitutional amendment authorizing 10 jurors to bring in a verdict in all criminal cases except first degree murder.

EVEN on the plea of the splendid group of Oregon prosecutors, on whom the people rely for protection against the oncoming invasion of gangsters and gunmen, the legislators refused to strengthen a weak spot in the jury processes. That body refused to set up, instead, a fair method by which the guilty could be convicted with less difficulty.

In consequence, a man and a woman in Portland were "taken for a ride." Their bullet-riddled bodies were found in a ravine near Seapooose. There was an arrest, a trial, and 11 jurors stood for conviction of the defendant of second degree murder. One juror was for manslaughter, he stood doggedly for manslaughter, the 11 had finally to yield to his demand for manslaughter, and the trial accordingly became a trial by a jury of one man.

It is such leaks in law enforcement that encourage gangsters to invade Oregon and that caused the California lynching. Portland Journal.
