Life Shortened—Tuberculosis cuts off two and a half years from the average length of life in the United States, is a fact brought before the public here this week by members of the Jackson County Health association, in urging support of the drive to sell tuberculosis Christmas seals.

The aim of the seal for the past 25 years has been the elimination of tuberculosis. Much has been accomplished, but as Dr. Henry F. Vaughan, commissioner of health in Detroit, has stated, "It will be a long time before tuberculosis, unquestionably, wholly preventable, will be wholly conquered." The fact that the disease is preventable is the challenge which health workers offer to all citizens in asking cooperation by the purchase of seals.
