AUTOMOBILE RIDE SCARES PRISONER AFTER 22 YEARS

SALT LAKE CITY—A child would have laughed with glee, but to John Corrietti, 56, "Dean" of the Utah

corrietti, 56, "Dean" of the Utah state penitentiary, his first automobile ride outside the gates in 22 years seemed almost unbearable.

Corrietti, who has served twice as long as any other prisoner held in the penitentiary, urged Warden R. E. Davis to "piesse take me back, please to home," when the automobile in Davis to "please take me back, please go home," when the automobile in which they were riding approached the business district.
Each time another automobile passed their car, Corrietti filinched

and crowded closer to his guards as and crowded closer to his guards as
though fearing some great monster
was threatening him. Once a streetcar passed and whistled. It was
almost too much for the prisoner. He
suried his head in his arms and wept.
On several occasions during his
term Corrietti has asked the warden

term Corrietti has asked the warder to "open the gates and let me go." but now he is satisfied with remain-ing within the gray walls, guards said Years behind those walls have not robbed him of health and vigor, War-

den Davis said. But with a world den Davis and. But with a worth a that has proceeded with bewildering speed since he entered the prison on conviction of irat-degree nurder and sentenced to life November 22, 1911. Corrietti prefers to remain there the rest of his life.

Despite his long years behind the
bars. Corrietti shaves daily, dresses
neatly and goes through exercises that
have kept his body straight and
atrong. He reads educational books,
the warden said. As a result of his

personal care, the prisoner has not been ill since confinement. "John has a perfect record here," Warden Davis said. "He would have been freed years ago had there been anyone to care for him."

The prisoner's wife was believed living in Italy, and a son, who has not been heard from since 1920, is somewhere in the United States.
