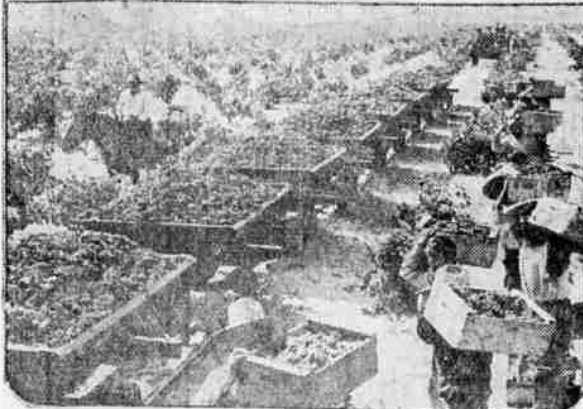
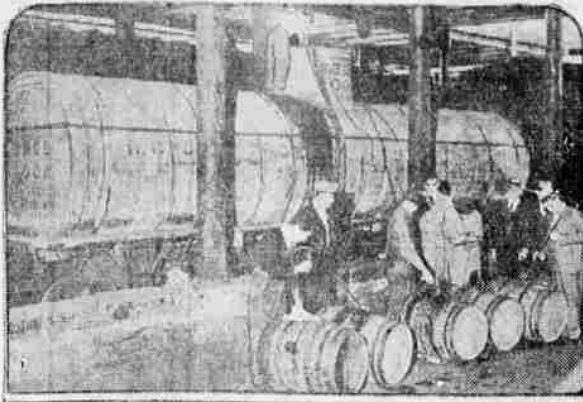


WINE APLENTY, IF AND WHEN—

GOWNS FOR HOSTESS AND GUESTS



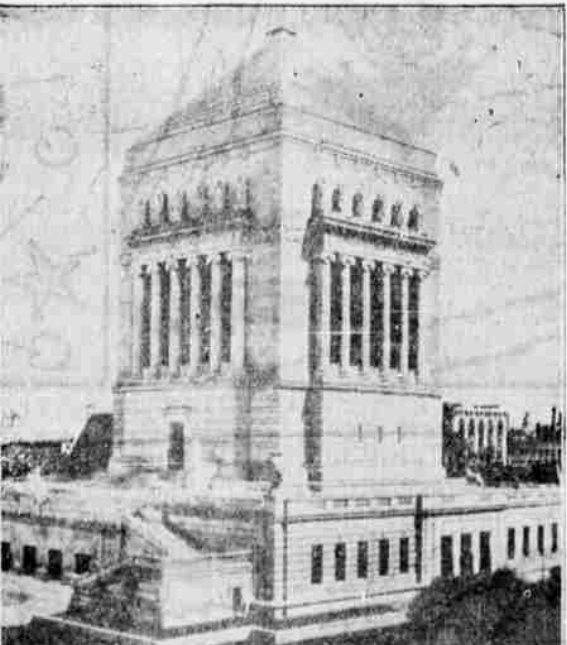

DEDICATE INDIANA WAR MEMORIAL



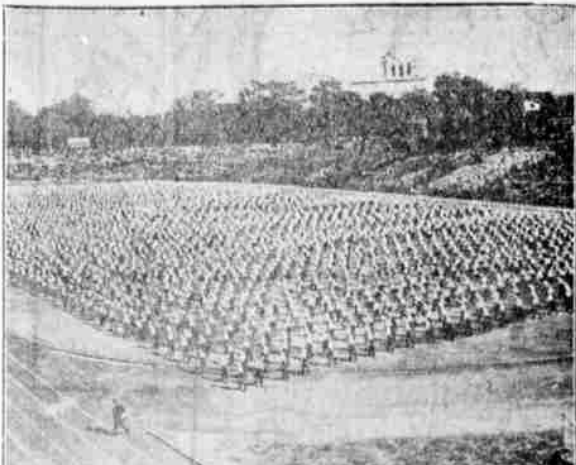
