

OLD AGE PENSION MODIFICATION BY SOLONS EXPECTED

With disposal by the legislature of the liquor control bill, modification of the old age pension law, as recommended by the county judges of the state is anticipated.

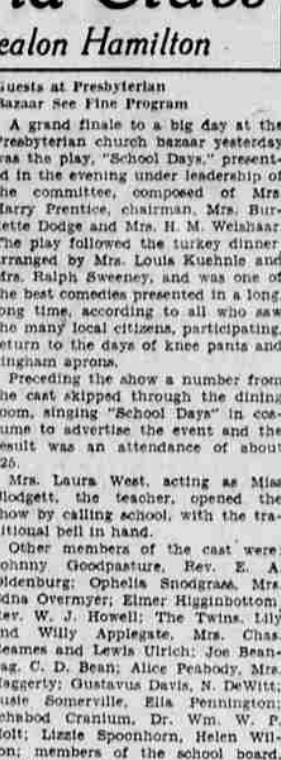
