Tuberculosis Prevalent—The need for a more intensive campaign for prevention of tuberculosis, especially in the Oregon country, where much has already been accomplished in this direction, is brought out in the following statement released by health officials: "Nearly one out of every five school students in Clackamas county, or almost 500 out of 2400 given the tuberculin skin test last spring showed infection by the tuberculosis germ. This does NOT mean disease. It DOES mean that in this typical Oregon county there is still enough tuberculosis prevalent to spread the germs to nearly one-fifth of the young people there. Four definite pulmonary cases were found, also a score or more needing close medical supervision and regulated living conditions to prevent a possible future development of active disease. The above proportions are approximately true for several other Oregon counties."
