### ROCKEFELLER, SR. IN POOR HEALTH

YONKERS, N. Y., Dec. 12. (AP)—Members of the family of John D. Rockefeller, Sr., were described by the Yonkers Herald-Statesman today as very much worried over the condition of the retired financier's health.

No information was forthcoming from the family, but sources close to the Pocantico Hills estate said that, while there has been no change in Mr. Rockefeller's condition, his physicians were not wholly satisfied with the progress of his recuperation from an attack of grippe he suffered last month.

### Education on Diet Is Part Of Fight on Tuberculosis

Learning menu planning and the essentials of a good diet is no longer a subject for girls only. Boys at Fairmont grade school, Multnomah county, are shown making junket, which is one of the lessons in a demonstration nutrition project conducted by Dr. Henrietta Morris, nutrition and health education specialist of the Oregon Tuberculosis association.

The junket is for the Jones family, though the cooks will eat it themselves, since the Joneses exist only in imagination. "Mr. and Mrs. Jones and their children were 'adopted' by the upper grade pupils at Fairmont," says Dr. Morris, "that we might plan meals which included all the essentials for each day's food needs, such as milk, fruit and vegetables."

"The pupils put this information into practice in selecting their own meals. A study of milk's place in the diet proved particularly interesting to children who live in a dairy community."

Details of the project, financed by funds from the sale of Christmas Seals, will be shared with Oregon teachers through a series of articles beginning in the December Oregon Education Journal.

"We are particularly interested in the field of health education," states Mrs. Saldie Orr Dunbar, executive secretary of the Oregon Tuberculosis association. "Because good health is one of the surest safeguards against tuberculosis, it is one of our most powerful weapons in conquering this disease which, is responsible for the death of one Oregon child under 20 years of age, every five days."

Few Violations Seen. Only 166 complaints of violations of fair practice and plant operating provisions of the code were received, Bruce said. All but 19 of these complaints were adjusted by correspondence.

Bruce announced it has been decided to proceed against two of the 19 alleged violators through the department of justice, which will seek to invoke the penalties for code violation against the offenders in federal court.

Robinson said the committee decided to turn over to the department of justice for action the complaint against the Willamette Valley Lumber company of Dallas, Ore., which instituted proceedings in federal court to enjoin the production quota. The hearing on the company's petition is scheduled for December 18 in federal court here.

Use Increasing. Carl W. Bahr, Washington, D. C. secretary-treasurer of the code authority, estimated lumber consumption for the first quarter of 1934 at 4,081,000,000 board feet for both hard and soft woods, an increase of 119,000,000 feet over the last quarter of 1933. Estimates of west coast lumber consumption during the first quarter are 1,035,000,000 feet, a definite increase over the estimated consumption of 924,000,000 feet during the current quarter. Western pine consumption for the coming quarter was predicted at 649,000,000 feet, an increase over the 549,000,000-foot estimate for the last quarter of this year.
