## CHICAGO BUTTER MART NOSE DIVES

CHICAGO, Dec. 14.—(AP)—A sharp drop of three cents a pound in wholesale butter prices today carried the market to a 35-year low level for December.

Choice butter, 92 score or extras, dropped to 16 cents a pound from yesterday's price of 19 cents, with cheaper grades off almost as much.

The abrupt decline was caused by a widespread report the Dairy Marketing corporation, a government subsidized agency, will cease buying butter at the end of this week. This organization had been buying butter for "clear purposes and is said to have taken 45,000,000 pounds.

## Gold Price Holds Same Level Today

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—(AP) The RFC price for newly mined domestic gold was unchanged today at \$34.01 an ounce.

This quotation was the same fixed last December 1 and repeated for 12 business days, during which the dollar has been slightly more than five to the pound.
