CHANGE IN TRUCK LAWS EXPLAINED BY GEO. S. BARTON

Numerous minor changes in the truck laws, made at the special session of the Oregon legislature, will be of benefit to certain special carriers and lighter equipment.

George S. Barton of the Association of Commercial Truck Owners, announced today, giving the following explanation:

There are still the four major classifications, namely "common carrier, contract carrier, private carrier and special carrier."

Little change was made in these classifications except as between the contract carriers and the special carriers. Dump trucks are now classified under the special carrier class...

The exemptions on agriculture, horticulture, poultry, etc., remain nearly the same, except when a truck is used exclusively in transporting the foregoing products...

Exemptions for the transportation of farm and garden products is limited to trucks owned and operated exclusively by the producers...

MONEY TROUBLES ARE SOLVED FOR SUPPORTER OF 13

CHICAGO, Dec. 19.—(UP)—The only remaining trouble of Joseph Flores, Colorado Springs citizen who has supported 13 persons on \$3 a day, is going to be settled.

The American Washing Machine Manufacturers' Association, learning that Flores' only remaining worry was two payments yet to be made on a washing machine, announced last night that it is going to make the payments.

"We're sending word to Flores that he can forget those last two payments," said Joseph R. Bohnen, secretary of the association.

The association will pay them as a Christmas present to his family," Bohnen added.

Flores, 45, and his wife have ten children. Flores also supports a brother. Yesterday, Flores made the final payment on his house and revealed then that he had supported the family on a \$90 a month salary.

"First you get a good wife; second you work like hell; and, third, everybody in the family must love everybody else," was Flores' explanation of how he accomplished the economic miracle.

Each month, Flores said, he gives half his salary to his wife to buy food. The family has meat three times a week and all fresh vegetables. All are healthy.

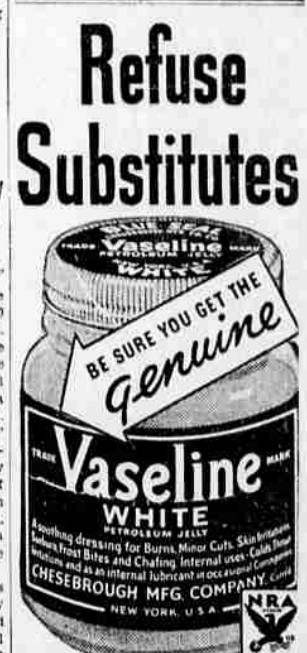
With his half of the money, Flores keeps up insurance policies for members of the family, pays doctor bills, takes the family to a show occasionally, gets one newspaper a week, and pays whatever other bills there are.
