

VETERANS URGED VOICE PROTESTS TO CONGRESSMEN

CCC MAY BUILD BIRD SANCTUARIES

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—(AP)—Senator Walcott (R., Conn.), chairman of the special senate committee on conservation of wild life resources, said today President Roosevelt was ready to authorize \$1,000,000 for purchase of areas which could be worked upon immediately

by the civilian conservation corps as sanctuaries for migratory birds. Walcott, after a conference at the White House, told newsmen details would be worked out by the secretary of agriculture.

RE-EMPLOYMENT ORDER TO KEEP PRESENT RULES

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—(AP)—The president's blue-act reemployment agreement, now extended four months and designed primarily for employers not under individual codes, in substance provides: Employers of factory or mechanical workers must pay a minimum of 40 cents an hour unless they were paying less than that for the same work July 5, 1929, in which case the rate at that time, but not less than 20 cents an hour, may be paid.

Employees paid on a weekly basis are to receive a minimum of \$14 in cities of more than 250,000 and 2, \$14 in cities between 250,000 and 2, \$14 in cities between 250,000 and 2, 500, with none receiving less than \$12.

The maximum working time is fixed at 40 hours, except in specific cases. Wages of more highly paid employes may not be reduced because hours are cut, and a normal ratio is to be maintained between minimum and higher paid levels.

Children under 16 are not to be employed, except that those over 14 may work three hours in daylight if it does not interfere with schooling.

REICHSTAG BURNED BY NAZIS, VERDICT

LONDON, Dec. 21.—(AP)—The "legal commission of inquiry into the burning of the reichstag," an unofficial organization of investigators, reported today it had concluded that the Nazis themselves, or through others, burned the reichstag building in Berlin last February.

The commission conducted its investigation over a period practically concurrent with the trial in Germany of five defendants, all of whom are described by the prosecution as communists, who face the death sentence if found guilty.

(In the course of the German trial, one of the defendants contended the fire had been caused by Nazis, not by communists, as the Nazi prosecution contends.)

MINIMUM LUMBER PRICE TO REMAIN

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 21.—(AP)—Present minimum price schedules for the lumber industry throughout the nation, allowing no margin for competitive price slashing, will remain virtually unchanged for the first three months of 1934, it was said today by members of the control committee of the national NRA lumber code.

The committee, in session here since Dec. 12, yesterday announced production allotments for the first quarter of next year, and probably will adjourn tomorrow.

MARSHFIELD, Ore., Dec. 21.—(AP)—Mrs. Fred Fisher, 66, of Roseburg, died in a Myrtle Point hospital last night from injuries suffered Monday in an automobile accident near Bridge, when a car in which she and her husband were riding plunged over a 46-foot embankment into the Coquille River.
