WOMAN ARRESTED ON CHECK CHARGE

Mrs. L. B. Cook, 25, formerly Chelena de Chaurant, was arrested here this morning by city and state police on charges of obtaining money under false pretenses, having admitted, according to officers, that she passed four worthless checks in this city, some of which were returned marked "account closed."

Mrs. Cook was arrested on a warrant out of Lane county, where she allegedly passed a worthless check.
