## RIVERS, HARBORS PROJECTS LISTED FOR NORTHWEST

\$2,106,000 Total Is Recommended by Army Engineer Board for Portland and Seattle Districts.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Cutting \$1,803,171 from the amount available in the last fiscal year, the board of army engineers today recommended \$2,106,000 for rivers and harbors projects in the Portland and Seattle districts for the fiscal year 1935, beginning July 1
