## DECEMBER CLOUDY, EXTREMELY MILD; RAIN SHY 1.12 IN.

Meteorological notes for December, compiled by W. J. Hutchison, local meteorologist, show a month of practically continuous cloudiness. Light rains were frequent and there was considerable foginess. Daily temperatures were unusually mild for December and means were somewhat higher than average.

Cloudiness predominated throughout the month with an occasional breaking of the overcast but without entirely clear skies on any day. Of the 31 days, 20 were recorded as totally cloudy and the remaining 2 as partly cloudy. Morning fogs were frequent and in many instances fog remained in the valley throughout the night, and occasionally through the days. Aircraft schedules were interrupted for short intervals during the more severe foggy weather conditions.

The unseasonable mildness of temperatures during the month is indicated by the fact that both daily maximums and minimums averaged several degrees above the means of these temperatures based on the past 23 years of December record. A maximum high temperature of 59 degrees occurred on the 13th and the lowest was recorded at 22 degrees on the 1st; a high minimum for December.

The frequency of light rains is evidenced by the number of days upon which precipitation was recorded. There were 24 days with amounts including traces, 16 of which show a fall of 0.01 inch or more of precipitation. A maximum 24-hour rainfall amounted to 0.90 inches occurred on the 11th and 17th. Traces of snow fall were recorded on the 15th, 16th, and 17th.

Although rainy weather was apparently plentiful the daily totals of moisture were small with a resulting subnormal monthly rainfall. A total of 1.99 inches accumulated in December, showing a deficiency of 1.12 inches. The seasonal precipitation also shows further deficiency; a total of 34 inches which is short of the normal by 3.99 inches at the close of December.
