

DRAMA INSTITUTE OPEN TONIGHT TO COUNTY LEADERS

Drama Institute for Jackson and Josephine county leaders will open this evening at 7:30 o'clock in the Jackson county courthouse, under the supervision of Mrs. Mabel C. Mack, county home demonstration agent. The institute is carried on through the co-operation of the state extension service and the National Playground and Recreational association of America.

Jack Stuart Knapp, staff member of the National Playground and Recreational association, will be instructor for the school, the purpose of which is to train leaders from the various county organizations, including granges, home extension units, scout groups and churches.

Two leaders are enrolled from each organization and they are trained to direct dramatic and recreational features in these various groups.

This is the third institute to be conducted in Jackson county, and the second to be instructed by Mr. Knapp. Many Jackson county leaders have attended the other institutes and have been directing activities in the various communities.

Fifty Jackson county leaders, and 13 from Josephine county have enrolled for the institute, which will continue through Thursday.

tion in the attempted burglary of the First National bank of Harrah, December 11. Roe, captured in the Shawnee gun fight that resulted in the fatal wounding of Underhill and Eva Mae Nichols, beauty parlor operator, was imprisoned three floors below.

"Roe got Eva Mae Nichols killed by holding her in front of him when the shooting started," Deputy Sheriff W. E. Eads and W. E. Agee quoted Inman as saying. "I'm going to take care of him."

Roe also has been accused of the Harrah robbery, which Underhill confessed before he died.

The four criminals still sought include Charles (Pretty Boy) Floyd, the Oklahoma bank robber who also is wanted for crimes in Ohio and for the Kansas City Union station slayings last June; Richard T. Galatas, also wanted for the Kansas City slayings; Clyde Barrow, Texas gunman accused of half a dozen murders, and Ed Davis, Kansas robber and the only one of the 11 escaping convicts from the Kansas prison last Memorial day to thwart capture or death.

GERMAN PASTORS FACE SUSPENSION

BERLIN, Jan. 8.—(AP)—One hundred pastors who protested from their pulpits Sunday against the suppression decree issued by Reichsbishop Ludwig Mueller may face suspension for insubordination, it was believed today.

Led by the Rev. Martin Niemoller, head of the opposition to the reichsbishop and his Nazi church regime, the pastors, read from a statement distributed by the insurgent ministers of the emergency federation.

After the meeting, at which Dr. Niemoller spoke, police broke up a throng of 1000 German Sunday school boys as they left the church. The youths attempted to parade, but were dispersed.

COUNTY REFUSES ALMS TO CONNER

Jackson county, through the district attorney's office, has officially notified Harney county that it will provide no funds for the care of G. Jean Conner, paroled for his confessed part in the vote-stealing of last February.

Conner applied to the Harney county welfare agent for relief for himself, his bride, his mother-in-law and sister-in-law. Harney county claimed Conner and family had not been there a sufficient length of time to come under relief provisions, and held the family was a charge of Jackson county.

Conner was married at Bend, Ore., December 2 last, without knowledge or consent of his parole patron, Attorney H. Von Schmaltz of Burns, who says the wife "is several years Conner's senior." The nuptials are a violation of the parole. Von Schmaltz withdrew his recommendation for a pardon. Future action in the case rests with Circuit Judge G. P. Skipworth of Eugene, the paroling judge.
