

### BIDS ARE OPENED ON SIXTEEN STATE HIGHWAY PROJECTS

Bridge Over Slough Near North Bend — Santiam Grading—Portland Paving Among Most Important

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 19.—(AP)—Bids for 16 highway projects involving an estimated total expenditure of \$500,000, under the national recovery act, were opened by the Oregon highway commission here yesterday.

The major items included an \$89,804 bridge over South slough in Coos county; grading of the Mill City-Gates section of the North Santiam highway, at \$80,507, and paving a section of 82nd avenue in Portland at a cost of \$67,915.

The projects and low bidders follow:

Benton County: Regrading, surfacing Rock Creek, Philomath section of Alsea highway, 4.12 miles, E. C. Hall of Eugene, \$98,720.

Clatsop County: Two bridges over Clatskanie river near Astoria; Joseph H. Anderson of Portland, \$10,400.

Coos County: Bridge over South slough near North Bend on Cape Arago secondary highway, Hillstrom Bros., of Maranfield, \$89,894; paving Marshfield section Oregon Coast highway, United Contracting Co., Portland, \$11,810.

Hood River County: Paving Hood River section Columbia River highway; United Contracting Co., \$11,890.

Lane County: Paving Eugene section Pacific highway, Mountain States Construction Co., Eugene, \$26,175; paving Springfield section McKenzie highway, United Contracting Co., \$5549.

Linn County: Bridge over Calapooya river near Holley on Halsey-Sweet Home secondary highway; Mountain States Construction Co., \$32,282.

Marion County: Bridge over Mill creek on Beaverton-Aurora secondary highway, Joseph H. Anderson, Portland, \$17,709; grading 4.24 miles of Mill City-Gates section North Santiam highway, Theo. Arens, Portland, \$80,507.

Multnomah County: Paving Sandy Boulevard-Halsey Street section 82nd avenue, Jacobsen-Jensen Co., of Portland, \$67,915.

Folk County: Bridge over Goose-neck creek on Dalles-Coast secondary highway, Setlenger Bros., of Portland, \$3433.

Umatilla County: Bituminous macadam, East Pendleton section of Old Oregon Trail, Northwest Roads Co., Portland, \$4843.

Union County: Bituminous macadam, La Grande section Wallawalla highway, Northwest Roads Co., \$4577.

Wallowa County: Regrading and surfacing Wallowa-Loistone section of Wallowa highway, 8.89 miles, Dunn & Baker of Klamath Falls, \$90,308. The Hart Construction Co. of La Grande bid, for which total was not given, may be slightly lower when bids are checked.

Yamhill County: Bridge over Chehalem creek at Newberg, Shattuck & Neiland of Portland, \$17,312.

### MARION PRISONER FREED TOO SOON; SHERIFF ON SPOT

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 19.—(AP)—Everett Battles, released from the Marion county jail by Sheriff A. C. Burk after serving only 139 days of a sentence of one year, today surrendered himself to serve out the remainder of his term or remain in jail until such time as the controversy over his allegedly illegal release has been settled.

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 19.—(AP) Judge L. H. McMahan of the Marion county circuit court today instructed the grand jury to investigate the action of Sheriff A. C. Burk in releasing Everett Battles from the county jail prior to the expiration of his minimum term.

In his instructions the judge also charged the jury to inquire into the bills rendered by the sheriff against Marion county for the operation of automobiles.

Battles, sentenced to serve a year in jail upon conviction as a hit-and-run driver of a car which struck and caused the death of Wai Hong, aged Chinese, was released from custody on January 6 after having served only 139 days of his term, during all of which time he was a trusty. Given credit for all "good time" allowances permitted by law he would have served 281 days. Judge McMahan advised the jurors.

Citing section 31-401, Oregon code, the instructions point out that any prisoner committed to the county jail "shall be actually confined" in the jail until he is legally discharged, and that the sheriff or jailer permitting his release otherwise is guilty of a misdemeanor. Conviction under the statute carries with it the penalty of dismissal from office, impeachment for not more than one year, a fine of not more than \$500 or both fine and imprisonment. Stressing the point that prisoners shall actually be confined in jail, the instructions charge "that Mr. Battles not only was at no time confined in jail, but that he has been given rides to Silverton in a car for his pleasure and recreation."
