ROSEBURG, Ore., Jan. 23.—(AP)—William H. Canon, named today by President Roosevelt for appointment as registrar of the U. S. land office at Roseburg is a resident of Medford, and served the land office as registrar from 1914 to 1923 under appointment by President Willson.

He succeeds H. A. Canaday, whose term expired January 16. Mr. Canaday, who practiced law in Medford for 14 years before coming to Roseburg 10 years ago, intends to remain in this city and will resume the practice of law.

Judge Canon is about 70 years of age, well known, and lives on a small fruit ranch near this city.
