

SHOT FROM HIP IN RESTAURANT BREAKS NO LAW

Oregon Control Board Sees
No Objection to Taking
Own Supply of Liquor Into
Public Dining Places

PORTLAND, Jan. 25.—(AP)—Although hotels and restaurants will not be permitted to dispense hard liquor under terms of the Knox law, the Oregon liquor control commission feels a person may take his own liquor to such a place and drink it in any manner he desires.

"As long as the individual does not create a disturbance or the place becomes a nuisance," Chairman McMoran of the commission said, "a person can take his own liquor into a restaurant or hotel and do his own drinking publicly in the manner he desires."

"The thing to be eliminated, in the opinion of the commission," he continued, "is the illicit sale of liquor and the attending lawlessness. If the act is universally supported, temperance will be ultimately achieved."

Five state liquor stores will be ready for operation in Portland, February 10, according to George L. Sammis, state control administrator. He said a store at Salem will be opened the next day, and one at Eugene the day following. Stores and agencies in other cities of the state will be opened rapidly from then on.

To Get Training.
Those selected to operate the Salem store will work in the Portland store on the opening day. Those who will operate the Eugene store will work in the Salem office on the day that establishment is opened, and the same process will be employed in training employees who will operate stores in other sections of the state.

SALFEM, Jan. 25.—(AP)—Expenditures by the Oregon liquor control commission for liquor stock and equipment, salaries and other materials are just charges against the state and the secretary of state must issue warrants for same, despite the suit pending before the state supreme court on the validity of the Knox bill appropriating funds for that purpose, the attorney-general held in an opinion handed down today.

Warrants Must Be Paid.
The opinion was requested by the liquor commission in view of the action of Klamath Falls to test the constitutionality of the act. The attorney-general held that all warrants for expenditures must be paid until such time as the entire act is declared unconstitutional.

Attorney-General J. H. VanWinkle added that indications point it is improbable that the law would be declared unconstitutional, namely that action referring to operation within incorporated cities. He held the act was legal until declared otherwise.

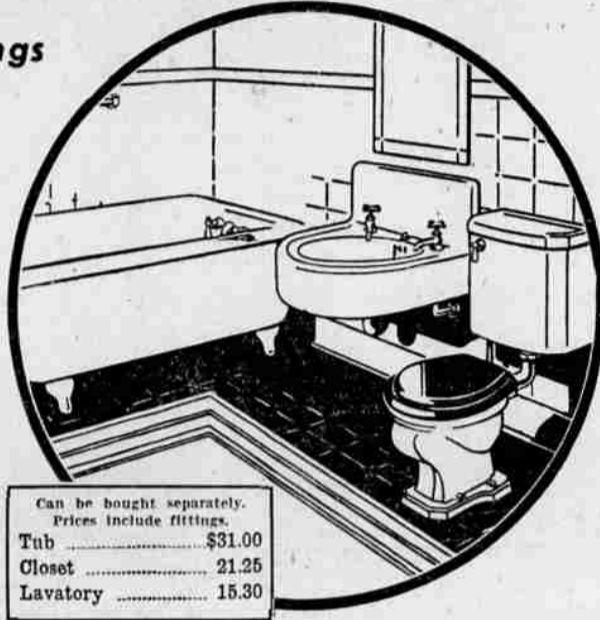

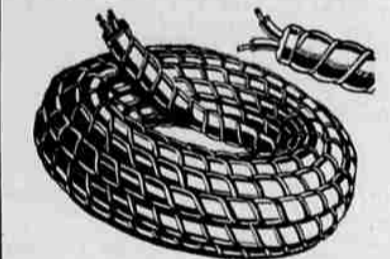

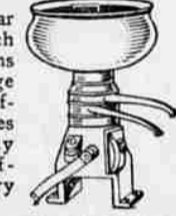
